FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK



LET'S TALK ENF!—Last month, I focused on the Purple Pig, the state major project of the California-Hawaii Elks Association. We talk a lot about the Pig in the Lodge, just possibly because the state Piggy Bank Chair is one of our Lodge members.

Nationally, the Elks' charitable functions are carried out through the Elks National Foundation (ENF). Here are some of the things that ENF does:

- ENF provides grants to local lodges like ours that we can use for charitable purposes. Recently, we've used our grants to support Alameda Food Bank and the Oakland Feather River Camp for construction of an art and activity center. If our annual giving exceeds \$4.80 per member, we qualify for an additional \$2000-\$3000 Gratitude Grant. Right now, for the year beginning April 1, we are at \$2.81 per member.
- ENF also supports Elks state major projects and has contributed massively to the Pig.
- ENF gives out 500 Most Valuable Student scholarships annually. The grants are competitive and range from \$4000 to \$50,000. ENF also awards up to 350 Legacy scholarships of \$4000 to children and grandchildren of Elks. The Lodge has nominated winners in both categories.
- ENF supports youth programs like drug awareness and Hoop Shoot.

Interested in supporting ENF? Eighty-six of our members and "widow members" contributed by marking off the \$10 optional contribution with their Lodge dues. You can also contribute by going to <u>https://www.elks.org/enf/supportENF.cfm</u>. Like the Pig, ENF offers an automatic monthly giving program (as little as \$5 per month) called Fidelity Club. ENF really likes this because it is a steady source of contributions that helps with future planning. At present, there are only 12 members of our Lodge in Fidelity Club, a little over 2% of our membership. Lots of room for improvement here!

Also like the Pig, if you shop on Amazon, you can designate 0.5% of the cost of your purchases to go to ENF (with no increase in price to you) by going to smile.amazon.com and selecting Elks National Foundation as your favored charity. Unfortunately, you can't support both ENF and the Pig this way at the same time.

ENF provides recognition to donors beginning with membership card stickers for \$50 contributed in a year and graduating to a series of pins for more significant cumulative gifts or enrollment in Fidelity Club.

Buy tickets to Charity Night -September 18th \$60 each- and help support our biggest fundraising event of the year.



General Announcement to Our Membership

Amendment to GL Permit No. W-074-19:

In October 2019, the Lodge approved an electrical/mechanical project to upgrade the electrical system, improve HVAC equipment, and provide a capacitive-loop system in the Lodge Room for the hearing impaired.

The authorized budget was \$250,000, of which \$150,000 was donated by a generous Member. Shortly thereafter, the COVID-19 pandemic began and the Lodge was closed. The work on the project came to a halt. We are ready to resume that work but, as in many other areas, the pandemic has disrupted supply chains, led to shortages, and caused significant price increases in the cost of labor, materials and equipment.

As a result, an increase in the original proposed budget of an <u>additional \$100,000 is needed</u>. Thus, the resulting total cost of the project to be budgeted will now be \$350,000.

There are sufficient funds available in our Facility Investment Funds to cover the additional expenditures. There will be <u>no</u> encumbrances or mortgage of Lodge assets to fund the project.

- First reading of this proposal at the Lodge Meeting, August 23, 2021
- Proposal will be published in the September Doings
- Second Reading and final approval of the proposed budget increase is scheduled for the Lodge Meeting on September 13, 2021.

If this amendment is approved by the Lodge, then the Lodge will seek approval of the amendment from Grand Lodge.

Grand Lodge has already approved a request to extend the time to complete the project to July 31, 2022.

Then take advantage of the various forms and certificates you can use through the year to recognize program participants and volunteers. Also, make sure to reach out to your committee

chairpersons to ensure they are recording and submitting the information to the Lodge Secretary. life. If you need help, contact your Lodge Secretaries, let this serve as a reminder to begin sending your six month dues and delinquent notices. If your Lodge has not Billing System, check into it on elks.org (Membership Tool Kit, Lodge billing) or contact your Area Membership Chair. The cost savings to your Lodge will be significant. Further, once the notices have been sent, have your Membership and Lapsation Committee contact these individuals. You would be

surprised what a little personal contact can accomplish. The Elks Legacy scholarships also open this month on elks.org. Legacy Awards are available to children and grandchildren of Elks' Members. Check on-line for eligibility requirements. The Elks National Hoop Shoot turns 50 this year and it is also just around the corner. Now is the time to start planning your local contest. If your Lodge is involved with this program, thank you. If it has been awhile since your Lodge participated, now is a good time to start. Start small; choose one school in your area and bring your program back to **District Hoop Shoot Director for** assistance. Finally, this is the time to submit your Lodge website for judging to receive the Grand Lodge 5-Star Award. State Association websites can also be submitted for judging as well. This is a great opportunity to demonstrate what your Lodge is accomplishing as well as advertise your Lodge to your community.


