

BUILD IT BETTER—"BIB" FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

After many years of leasing a building to house the Lake Oconee Elks Lodge, the decision was made to purchase a building and transform it into your lodge. The established committee to oversee this huge undertaking is doing a great job of transforming the space and maximizing the potential space of each area, all while being fiscally responsible and staying within the approved budget. Phase 1 has been completed and now we look to Phase 2 and beyond.

Many members have come forward and voiced their "wishes" that they would like to see considered and possibly included in the new building. Some of the proposed items on the "Wish List" are audio and video upgrades, a band stage, bar stools, bathrooms and HVAC for the secondary building, charcoal grill upgrade, new deck furniture, gas grill, offices and storage space for the secondary building, paved parking lot, rear deck, refrigerated salad bar and restaurant furniture.

The Lake Oconee Elks Lodge doesn't operate as a regular business. Most of the funds raised or earned goes to support numerous charities, local and statewide, civic and Veteran's endeavors and programs. With that said, the "Wish List" or extras that members would like to possibly see in our new building, will have to be accomplished through additional funding beyond the existing approved budget. So, a Build it Better, or BIB, fundraising campaign has been launched and is underway to be able to make some of the "wishes" a reality!

The purpose of this campaign is to raise money through donations to address some or all of the desires and long-term needs for our lodge. 2023-2024 Gratitude Grant

The Gratitude Grant from Elks National Foundation to Lake Oconee Elks Lodge #2849 was used for a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics) program (a.k.a. "CrunchLabs") focused on Greene County, Georgia's 4-Her's (grades 4-12). The grant provided the funding for 24 students to learn engineering principles and apply those principles building weekly laboratory experiments that applied the engineering theories in practical manners. The projects included, Rocket Launchers, Boomerang Cars, Ball Levitation with Air, Catapults, etc. Engineering principles included rotational energy, worm gears, momentum transference, Coanda effects on cylindrical items and much more. At the conclusion of the course, 28 students were offered a campus tour of the Georgia Technical Institute of Georgia. This program increased the overall participation of area students in the 4-H program that has benefited from past Elks Gratitude Grants (i.e., Archery, Audio Visual Training).







Think like an engineer: Greene County 4-H Crunch Labs

Greene County 4-H believes in offering a space for students to explore new opportunities, create new ideas, and expand their horizons. By using CrunchLab Build Boxes, Greene County 4-H offered an after-school project dub focusing on the engineering design process. Over the course of six weeks, 4-H'ers built a disc launcher, a trip wire, a domain catapult, a boomerang car, an air bail, and a rocket revolver. Through these build boxes, students engaged in games and challenges to test their builds. This after-school project club fostered an environment of determination, reallience, patience, and creativity. This program would have not been possible without our 4-H Volunteer and Lake Oconee ELK, Jon Dill, and the Lake Oconee Elks Lodge Gratifude Grant, which sponsored this project club. 


