**Doc's Corner**

**CORONARY ARTERY CALCIUM SCORING, WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW**

Coronary calcium score is a simple non-invasive scan that reveals plaque in coronary arteries and helps predict the risk of heart disease.

This non-invasive CT test detects calcium deposits in the walls of coronary arteries, i.e. a sign of atherosclerosis which causes the majority of heart attacks.

Calcium Score is a number. It reflects the amount of calcium in the walls of the coronary arteries, the more calcium present...the more plaque has accumulated over time. (of note, this is not a stress test....no treadmills....no dyes....no injections....no IV's....you lie flat in a CT scanner. Hold your breath for a few seconds and you're done).

Calcium doesn't appear in healthy arteries (score-0) It is a marker of chronic inflammation and arterial injury.

What a calcium score doesn't detect is soft plaque. It doesn't show blockage or blood flow limitation and reflects only cumulative damage. It should be used as a risk detector, a decision aid, and as a motivator for positive change.

For adults 40-75 years of age: CAC 0 low short-term risk, CAC 1-99 consider statin and assess additional risk factors, CAC >100 statin recommended, CAC> 400 statin therapy, lifestyle optimization, physician directed evaluation

The calcium score adds the most value when traditional risk tools leave uncertainty.

CAC score reflects the total burden of plaque, it does not indicate whether blood flow is restricted that is the purview of CT angiogram.

IN SUMMARY: CAC doesn't predict the future but helps you shape it. CAC is a concrete number. For individuals with low scores, it brings relief and prompts continued smart choices. For others, it brings clarity...disease is present.... Now is the time to modify behavior.

## 200 CLUB 50/50 RAFFLE

1. **Monthly Drawing:** Every month for 12 months there will be a drawing on the third Pub Night of the month commencing on October 17, 2025. The drawing will take place at 6:30 pm. Winners need not be present.
2. **Tickets:** 200 Tickets will be sold with each ticket having a number from 1-200. The ticket number you buy will be your number for all 12 monthly drawings. Tickets are \$5 per month, but you must pay \$60 (\$5 x 12 months) up front for the whole year. Payments of less than \$60 will not be accepted.
3. **50/50 Split Between Monthly Winner and Lodge:** Every month the pot will be \$1,000 (\$5 x 200 numbers/tickets). \$500 will go to the purchaser of the winning number, and \$500 to the Lodge for Kitchen Equipment Repairs and Purchases. In total, the Lodge's share would be \$6,000.
4. **Ticket Limitations:** Every Elks member will be limited to 2 tickets/numbers. Non-members will be limited to 1 ticket/number. Only Elks members will be permitted to purchase tickets/numbers from September 15 – 30, 2025. Non-members will be permitted to purchase tickets/numbers commencing October 1, 2025.
5. **Master List:** A master list will be maintained of who is assigned to each number in case you lose your ticket.
6. **Purchase of Tickets/Numbers:**
  - A. Tickets will be sold randomly on a first-come, first-served basis. Ticket numbers will be pulled out of a drum or other similar receptacle.
  - B. Requests for specific numbers will not be honored, with the exception that the Lodge will purchase the number 161. If the number 161 is drawn, the Lodge will win the entire monthly pot of \$1,000 for Kitchen Equipment Repairs and Purchases.
  - C. Tickets will be sold from September 15, 2025 – October 15, 2025, or until all tickets are sold. If tickets are still available on October 15, 2025, Elk members may purchase up to two additional tickets/numbers beyond the allotted limit of two, and non-members may purchase an additional ticket/number.

## Parents, Grandparents and Members All

I am happy to announce that the Most Valuable Student Scholarships are now open to all high school seniors. The Elks National Foundation awards 480 scholarships worth \$4,000 dollars and 20 scholarships worth \$30,000 dollars based on academics, leadership and financial need. The Elks National Foundation awards 350, \$4,000 dollar Legacy scholarships. These awards are open to children, grandchildren, stepchildren and step grandchildren of members in good standing. ## 2025 Car Show

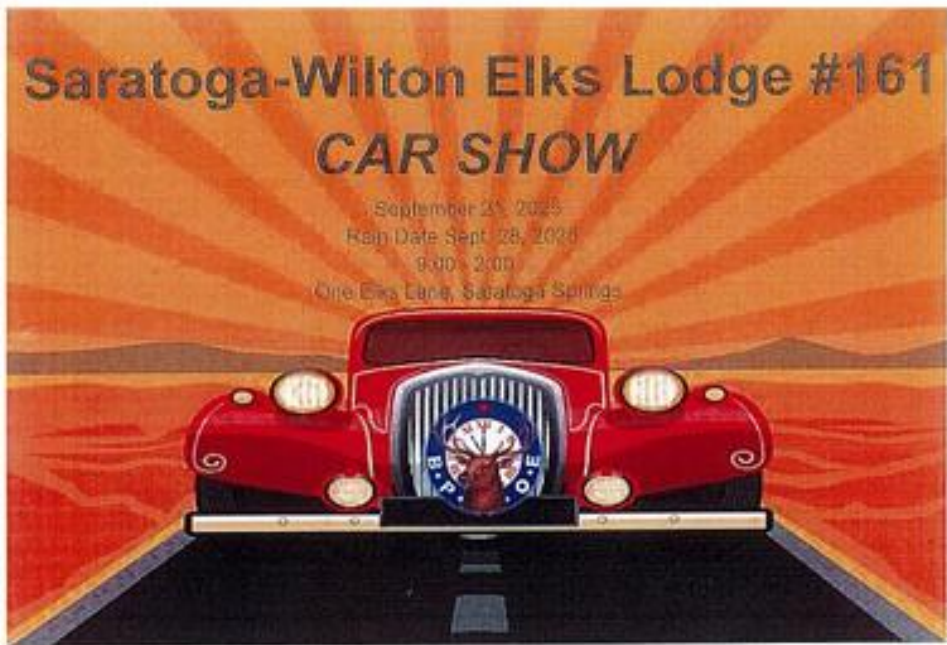
