**Doc's Corner**

**IMMUNIZATION UPDATE**

I know it's already November and many of you have not yet considered seasonal vaccinations.....

Here's a quick update:

Seasonal flu vaccines have been available since September. This year's vaccine a trivalent one-dose immunization. It contains:  
 2 influenza A subtypes (H1N1 and H3N2) and 1 influenza B subtype (B Victoria)

New COVID vaccine boosters became available in September and are recommended for seniors >65 y.o. and those younger with compromised health conditions (those seeking vaccine in this group may need an Rx. from their health care provider).

Please don't forget other vaccines available for protection against these disease entities:

Pneumococcal Vaccine.....for those >50 and children <5 .....and those at increased risk

Herpes Simplex Vaccine (Shingrex ).....for those >50 (2 doses separated by 2-6 months) to prevent shingles and its serious complications and finally.....

RSV (respiratory Syncytial Virus) .....for special infants, certain women during pregnancy, those 60-74 at increased risk of severe RSV disease, and those >75

To prevent serious respiratory diseases and their complications.

New recommendations from the CDC are confusing so I recommend reviewing guidelines set up by these organizations:

AAP .....American Academy of Pediatrics AMA.....American Medical Association AAFP.....American Academy of Family Physicians

Always rely on your primary care health provider for guidance!

## Americanism Essay Contest theme, deadlines

The Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee selected "What Does Service to Your Country Mean to You?" as the theme for our Americanism Essay Contest this year.

Last year, more than 40,000 essays were submitted. That means a minimum of 40,000 families discussed Americanism and what it means to be an American. Students, teachers, parents, brothers, and sisters talked about the values that go along with being a citizen. I can't think of a better way to promote Americanism to young people and refresh it in everyone's minds than to participate in this program.

Lodges should make sure information submitted is complete and legible starting with phone numbers, emails, and addresses. In addition, we ask each Lodge to send the total number of essays they judged to the district or state chair so we have a record of participation. The state chair will then report their total to the Grand Lodge administrator.

Keep in mind that you should send your essay to the Lodge nearest your home, and only to one Lodge!

Each level of judging will send the top three in each division to be judged on the next level. The deadlines for each level of judging are:

- 1) Students send essays to Local Lodge no later than December 15, 2025.
- 2) Local Lodge sends essays to District Chair no later than January 31, 2026.
- 3) District Chairman sends essays to State Chair no later than February 28, 2026.
- 4) State Chair sends essays to Contest Administrator no later than March 31, 2026.

The contest rules are: Eligible participants must be students enrolled in fifth, sixth, seventh, or eighth grade; essays must be no more than 300 words and typed or legibly printed in ink (by the entrant); essays must be submitted to the Lodge nearest the entrant's address; the entrant must be identified by name, grade, school attending, and the sponsoring Elks Lodge on the essay itself; and the cover page provided on our website must be attached to the essay.

This cover sheet will follow the essays through every level of judging. We also ask that Local Lodges scan the essays for use of AI (artificial intelligence) and if found, disqualify the essay. What are our judges looking for in their grading criteria? Here is a quick look at what's important and how many points are awarded to each area:

- 1) Originality: 30 points
- 2) Development of theme: 40 points
- 3) Mechanics and neatness: 30 points

The contest has four divisions, one for each grade level.

Winners in each division receive a plaque and a monetary prize, with first place winning \$1,000, second place earning \$500, and third place receiving \$250.

Publicize your contest via social media, newsletters, and email blasts as well as your local newspapers and radio stations.

Prizes at the local level are also encouraged.

National winners of first, second, and third place in each division will be announced in our spring newsletter and awards can be picked up at our Fraternal Committee Booth at our next Grand Lodge Session in Chicago on July 2, 2026.

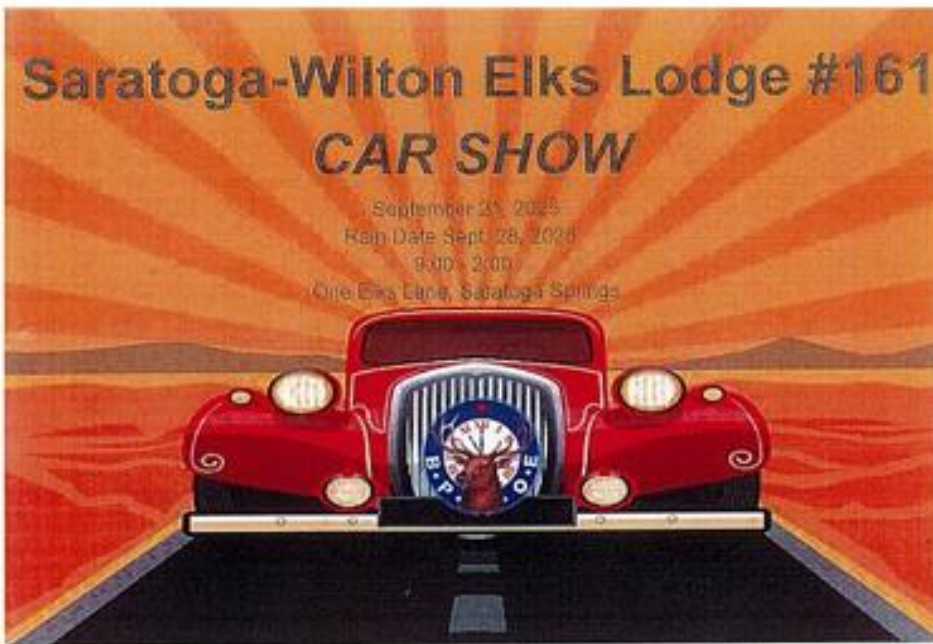

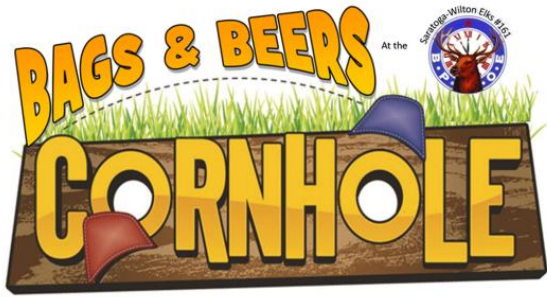
