VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

Old and new members may not know that this building was erected with 85-90% with volunteer labor. These are some of the many 2025 accomplishments.

The **Neon Light Project** took two years to complete and was finally up and running in March 2026. Volunteers committed to make it work were Wayne Peterson, Stuart Duff (electrician), and Don White who installed a new ballast. That didn't work so they started replacing neon tubes, one at a time. That didn't work so we started replacing neon tubes - one at a time. A manlift was donated by Ron Melheim, and Carol Wise operated the lift. The lift had to be delivered and picked up several times then finally - let there be light!



The **Parking Lot Project** was handled by Randy Hathaway, Eric Arnston and Ryan Roach. They furnished the road grader, compactor and several other machines. They decided to replace the parking blocks with poured concrete sidewalks. Thanks to Jason Franklin, Justin Klaasen and Freddy Martin for building the concrete forms. We very much appreciate the donation from Van Ness Construction who poured 250 linear feet of sidewalk. Crushed rock for the driveway was donated by Shold's Excavating and Cotton Concrete gave us a good deal on the purchase of the concrete. Thank You to Mel Mefford who donated the cost of the new Elks signs on Hwy. 20 and to Jason Franklin, Rich Stapf, Jr. and Rich, Sr. for installing the signs.

The **Can Company** was started when this Lodge was built and at the time it provided about \$1,000 to our annual budget. Everything over and above \$1,000 went to the RV Club - known as the Wapitis. The Can Company is on-going and is still functioning to this day although they are not making a lot of money. At one time we thought about quitting but Don White stepped up to the plate and said he would take over. He did - it's still running and we've taken in about 4 loads (900-1100#) in the last couple of months. Since the county has stopped the recycling effort - we will take ALL your aluminum cans.

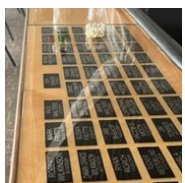


The **BBQ Pit Project** was started by Dave Sather - donating all the pipe and supports for the structure. Gary Jondeau welded all the work on the supports. It was at a standstill for many years and Jim Aman decided he would finish the roof. That project is completed after all these years and ready for use.

RV Park - Thank you Jim Aman for managing the RV park and all the extra work around the Lodge. He wears many hats! You can find him tending bar, helping in the kitchen, cooking and cleaning up, and generally volunteering for anything that needs to be done around the lodge.



Bar Plaques. Originally the plaques were sold for \$50/plaque and the money supported the building of the bar—they took in \$14,800! This was used to build the bar - material only - and volunteer work finished the beautiful bar it is today. It didn't stop there - we continued to sell plaques and have brought in between \$50,000 and \$60,000 for our Lodge. We're getting to the end of bar space! We have one space left and we can do a 50 pour or a 60 pour. We have 40 now and this will be the last pour. If you want a plaque, sign up now and take it to 50 or 60. Special thanks to Gretchen helping me to keeping track of the bar plaques.




There are many more completed projects we'll report on and in the coming months we will provide some fun history on our Lodge.

Volunteers are one of the most important aspects of our lodge and Elkdom. If you want to get involved in a project, check with the office and they will put you in touch with involved members.

VETERAN SPOTLIGHT

**MEET WILLIAM HARVEY GOINES, THE VERY
FIRST BLACK NAVY SEAL, REMEMBERED
FOR A PIONEERING LEGACY AND SERVICE.**



In 1962, William ""Bill"" Goines became a member of the original SEAL Team Two — making him the first African American Navy SEAL in history.

He entered one of the most elite, most demanding, and at that time most racially exclusive institutions in the United States military and became part of its founding class. He spent the next 32 years proving that his presence there was not an experiment.

- Three tours in Vietnam.
- Multiple honors and distinctions across three decades of active service.
- Retirement in 1987 as a Master Chief Petty Officer — the highest enlisted rank available. A career that spanned the full arc of what the Navy SEALs became as a force, from their earliest operational years through their evolution into the most recognized special operations unit in the world.

The barrier he broke in 1962 was not a small one. The SEALs were built around a culture of extreme selectivity — physical, psychological, and in that era, racial. Getting through that selection process as a Black man in 1962 required not just the physical and mental capability the training demanded, but the additional weight of doing it in an environment that had not been designed with his presence in mind and was not always welcoming of it.

He got through. He served. He led. And then he spent his years after retirement mentoring the people who came after him — turning his own history into infrastructure for others.

He passed away on June 10, 2024, at 87 years old. The legacy he left runs through every Black man and woman who has since worn the Trident — through every person who found the door slightly less closed because he had been the first one through it.

- ◆ First Black Navy SEAL in 1962.
- ◆ Thirty-two years of service.
- ◆ A legacy measured in every door he opened by walking through it himself.
