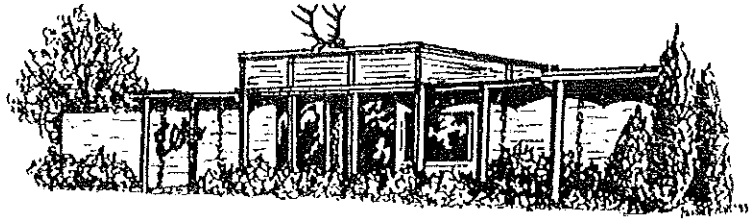

What a great summer it has been so far, as we look forward to a great August. Despite a couple of mainline breaks resulting in a loss of water, the course for the most part has held up fairly well. The crew and I continue to try our best to provide enjoyable playing conditions for all on a daily basis. Although we make mistakes, I want to thank all those members who have given positive compliments to the crew, it has lifted their spirits and made it a more enjoyable summer for all.

Towards the end of July we experienced quite a few days of hot weather, and with it an increase in irrigation. Please be aware that some areas of the course act as water collection spots as the irrigation run times have increased. It is our goal for the future to spot and remedy these areas. For now, we acknowledge and appreciate all the attentiveness that has been given by members and guests to keep carts out of these areas. As everyone may have noticed we changed the way we rake bunkers this season. We decided to do this for a few reasons and I'll try to explain a couple of them the best I can. The major reason was due to lack of extra sand. We are making an attempt to limit the amount of actual sand on the bunker faces and use the extra for the flat areas of the bunkers, reducing the percentage of dirt contamination to swing through. Another reason is to limit the amount of plugged "fried egg" shots out of the bunkers. With solid faces the ball should roll into the bottoms of the bunkers (or close) and allow for an easier shot with enough sand to work with. Although we have modified it to your course, this type of raking is referred to as the "Aussie style" of raking. We have noticed that this type of raking has led to an increase in bunker weeds and it is our goal in the future to remedy that situation.

Please remember to fix your ball marks and have a great August.

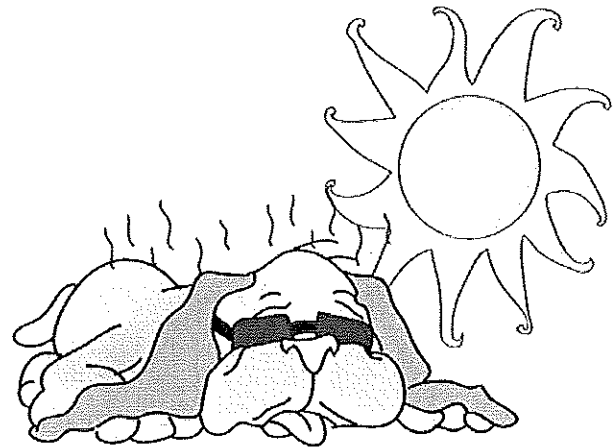

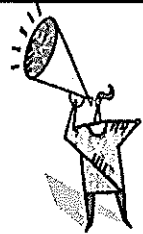

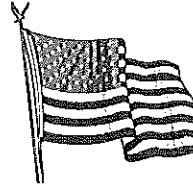
