The Red Ribbon History

ED RIBBON WEEK is the nation's oldest and largest drug prevention awareness program. The National Family Partnership started Red Ribbon Week after the death of Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena.

Enrique "Kiki" Camarena was born on July 26, 1947 in Mexicali, Mexico. He graduated from Calexico High School in Calexico, Calif. in 1966. After graduation, he joined the U.S. Marines where he served for two years. Following his military service, Kiki joined the Calexico Police Department and later moved to the El Centro Police Department. On June 28, 1974 he became part of the Drug Enforcement Administration. Seven years later he was assigned to the resident office in Guadalajara. He worked out of this office for four and a half years and was close to exposing a major drug trafficking operation. On February 7, 1985 Kiki was kidnapped, he was brutally tortured and murdered by the drug traffickers he was investigating in Mexico. He was 37 years of age.

Shortly after Kiki's murder, U.S. Congressman Duncan Hunter and Calexico High School classmate Henry Lozano launched Camarena Clubs in Kiki's home town of Calexico, Calif. Club members wore red ribbons and pledged to lead drug free lives. Red Ribbon Week eventually gained momentum

Red Ribbon Week eventually gained momentum throughout California and later the United States. The Elks have been supporters of Red Ribbon Week since the beginning. The campaign was formalized by President and Mrs. Reagan who served as honorary chairpersons. Congress officially established Red Ribbon Week in 1988. Nationwide, it is celebrated annually in the last week in October.

Elks Announce Red Ribbon Week dates for this year.

The annual Red Ribbon Week celebration will be held October 23 through the 31st this year.

The Elks promote Red Ribbon Week in schools throughout the last week in October by providing Red Ribbons, Bookmarks, Color Books and other educational materials. The week is full of activities and events to promote living a drug free lifestyle.

The National Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective order of Elks have contests open to all children. There is a 4th-5th Grade Poster Contest with the theme of "Drugs Take Away...", leaving the children to fill in the blank with their poster. The poster should be on 8 1/2 X 11 paper. These posters are due by November 1st to your local Elks lodge. They will be judged for a local winner, then forwarded on for district, state and national competition. prizes will be awarded for each step of the competition.

Also with the same theme is an essay contest for middle school students, 250 words or less due by March 1st 2019.

The Elks have a video contest with the same theme consisting of a 3 to 4 minute video depicting a similar Drug Awareness Message. The due date on the video is also March 1st 2019. These videos are judged as Pre High School, High School and Post High School.

These contests can be in school, scouts church groups or just as an individual entry.
