There are many things in the Elks magazine that should be of interest to all . One of these is the Annual Report of the Grand Secretary. If you have not read it, you should. Here are some interesting tidbits .

1. Of Charitable Activities by State, Idaho Elks ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation in charitable, educational, welfare and patriotic work. Our giving totaled \$11,360,558. That is 11+ million dollars folks. For the size of our state and number of members, that number is huge.
2. Donated hours by all Elks members @\$24.69/hr. = \$531,226,485. That is, over ½ billion dollars.
3. Non- Cash Contributions by members and helpers = \$675,985,245. Again, over .6 billion dollars

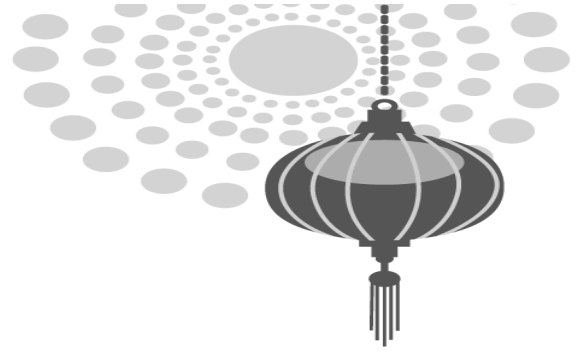
