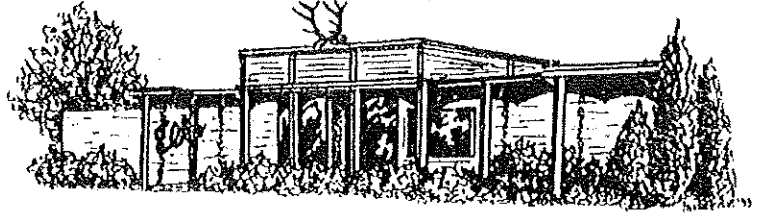

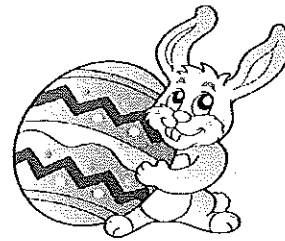
HOUSE RULES FRIENDLY REMINDER

The course is open! After a long couple of snowy months it sure is nice to see the grass again. We as a crew have a lot of improvements that we'd like to make this year and are excited to get started now that the snow has left. A little change in schedule; aeration has been moved to the 15th and 16th of this month. This change will allow for the soil to dry up a bit and the turf to begin to grow, creating what we expect to be a quicker recovery time.

Although the crew is small at this time, we will work diligently to make sure the course is in a playable condition daily. We understand that the bunkers are not in the greatest shape right now, however we will be cleaning those out and hopefully adding more sand to those that need it here shortly.

On a side note, we are looking for 5-8 members who are interested in being on the greens committee. Committee members will be a liaison to other golfers. Meetings will be held every 2nd Tuesday from April-October. It is also suggested that committee members serve in their position for at least 2 years. This will help for organization and prioritization of golf course matters. If you are interested please contact Paul Sugden at sugdendens70@gmail.com or myself at seanlanphere@gmail.com.

The beginning of the season is always a good time for a refresher on **Golf Etiquette...**

- Please remember to **repair your ballmark** plus one other. This will really help keep the greens in the best playing condition. (see illustration)
- Please **replace your divot**. No matter how bad of shape it is in there is a good chance it will survive. If not, we can then replace it with sand. If you are filling old divots with sand please level the sand off to the height of the fairway or tee.
- Please **place rakes on the outside edges of the bunker**; not in the bunker.
- Please **knock sand off of your shoes** when exiting a bunker. Bunker sand is not the same consistency or texture as the sand used on greens and may cause a layering issue and it may interfere with a good putt.
- Use cart paths whenever possible, this will reduce the chances for soil compaction and damaged turf.
- And most of all **HAVE FUN!**

The Proper Way to Repair a Ball Mark



- 1 Use a prolonged ball mark repair tool (preferably), knife, key or etc.
- 2 Loosen at the edges of the mark - not the middle of the depression.
- 3 Bring the edges together with a gentle twisting motion, but don't lift the grass. Try not to tear the grass.
- 4 Smooth the surface with a dish or foot. You're done when it's a surface that you would putt over.

"Our Kids"

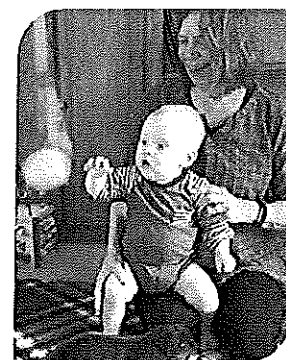

Kasper is one of "Our Kids". He was born prematurely, 13 weeks early, and had respiratory distress and bleeding in his brain called a "hemorrhage". He spent his first couple months in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. He is now, chronologically, almost one year old. However, correcting for prematurity, he is 8 months old. Due to his medical fragility, Kasper has been sequestered at home, in order to reduce his exposure to germs. Therefore, his Elks Therapist sees him first thing in the morning to decrease the chance of germs being carried to him from other children.



Despite his difficult start in life, he has been meeting his developmental milestones. Initially, it appeared that he had escaped the consequences associated with the hemorrhage activity in his brain. However, more recently, it was noted that he was beginning to use his left hand a lot more than his right hand for reaching and grasping toys and he was keeping his right hand fistled more often.

His Elks Occupational Therapist has developed exercises and "play activities" that will promote awareness and more active use of his right upper extremity. His parents follow through with the exercises every day and we are seeing much improvement! He is using his right side much more often, even though it is more difficult for him to open his hand to grasp and release objects. He is also getting ready to crawl.

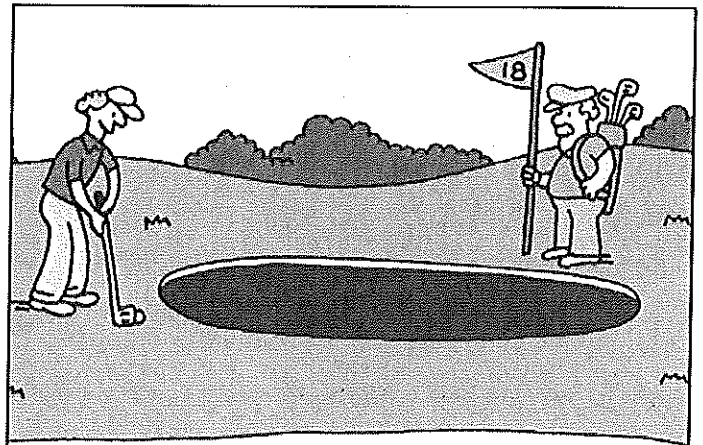
