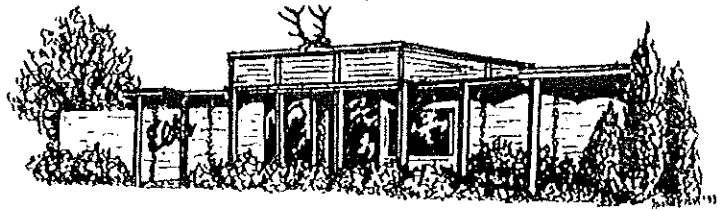

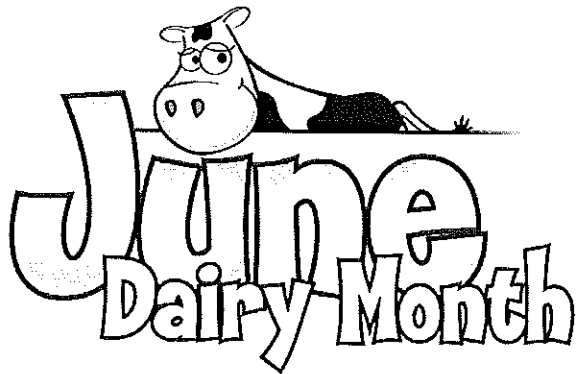

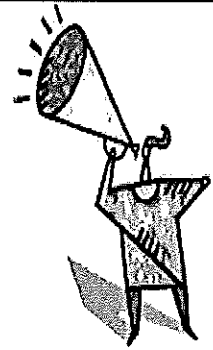

June is here! Besides a few days of hotter than normal temperatures in May, the course is thankful for the rain and cooler temps. This month should provide some good weather and plenty of hours to get a round (or two) in. I'm sure you've noticed that we have added new bunker sand to many of the bunkers on the course. A big thanks to the Men's Club for donating some of their funds to help us acquire the much needed sand. We will continue to add more as the season progresses and we appreciate your patience as we learn how this new sand reacts to irrigation and play.

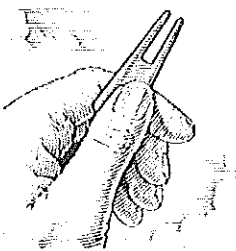
With warmer temperatures and diminishing rainfalls expected, it is important to remember to fix your ball marks and fairway divots. As always, the best method for repair is to replace the section of turf that has been removed by the shot, however if not possible fairway divots should be filled and smoothed out to soil, not grass level. Using your foot to pack and level the spot out is great way to keep our mower reels from coming into contact with divot sand giving a better chance of recovery throughout the season. Below you will find the proper way to fix ball marks. It is important not to lift the turf up with your tool, as this separates the grass from its roots. Please see below for the proper procedure.

This month we are hoping to get a few more projects underway if not finished. As mentioned in previous trumpet articles, we really hope to get the tree trimming done this month. Unfortunately we have been unable to find the time to do this, however we believe this is the month that we can get it done. Also we will be doing some work on one of the tees on 2 as well as on 5. It is our hope that the issues involved with these tees will be resolved before months end. While working on projects we hope to provide golfers with satisfactory playing conditions daily, we will do our best to remain out of the way and your patience will be greatly appreciated.

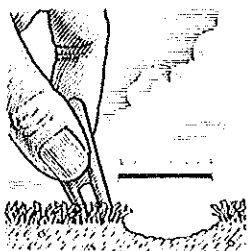

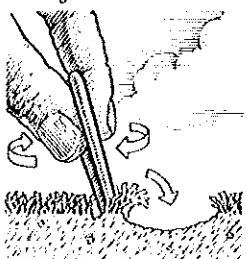
1 Use a prolonged ball mark repair tool (preferably), knife, key or tee.



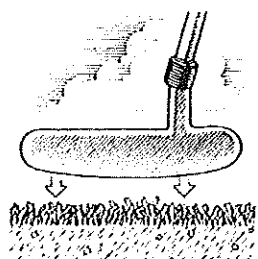
2 Insert at the edges of the mark- not the middle of the depression.



3 Bring the edges together with a gentle twisting motion, but don't lift the center. Try not to tear the grass.



4 Smooth the surface with a club or foot. You're done when it's a surface that you would putt over.

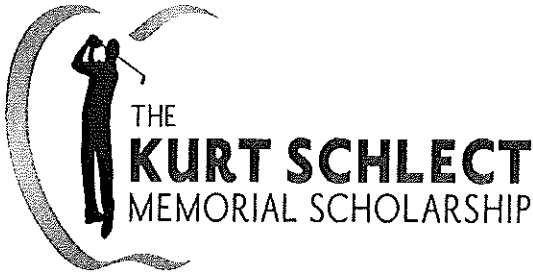

Kurt Schlect Memorial Scholarships for 2019 have been awarded to two veterans of the Yakima Elks Summer Golf Program—Connor Batali and Piper Lukas—who seek to advance their educations this fall. Each scholarship is worth \$2,500, an increase over last year's awards of \$2,000.

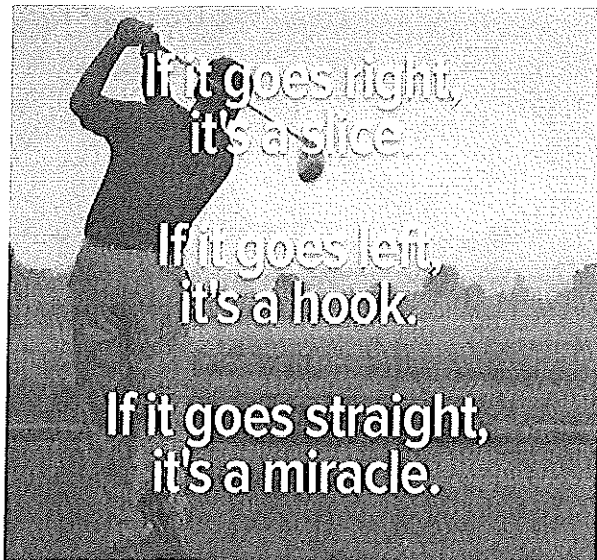
Batali will attend Washington State University to study business, while Lukas is headed to George Fox University with a desire for an eventual career in counseling.

The competitive scholarship application process was managed by the Kurt Schlect Memorial Scholarship Committee, whose members are Larry Fitzgerald (chairman), Cathy Blore, Christian Schlect, Jeff Stevens, and Helen Wendt. This independent committee was formed in 2017 with the three prong goal of encouraging future participation in Yakima Elks Junior Golf; providing educational support to worthy students with a history of past participation in our club's annual summer junior golf program; and honoring the memory of Kurt Schlect, a golfer who left the fairway much too soon.

Finances for our scholarship effort are handled by the Yakima Valley Community Foundation.

Both Connor Batali and Piper Lukas have been invited to the Elks Lodge on July 26 to attend the concluding luncheon for this summer's junior golfers and their parents.
