They spend their time traveling to locations where Tara will be participating in some type of archery competition. (This is homeschooling in a serious way.)

Suzanne has worked a variety of temporary jobs while aiding Tara's quest for a spot on the US National Archery Team. Tara will be attempting to compete in all the necessary Target and Outdoor Nationals qualifying competitions put on by USA Archery and NFAA to hopefully qualify for the US National Archery Team and represent the USA in all upcoming world events. Tara has shot in over 50 tournaments in this quest, with many 1st through 3rd place finishes. She is a multiple State and National Champion and is well known and respected in the Archery World, and ranks near the top with the best World shooters in her division.

Tara has been a National and World competitor since she was 9 and she is 15 this year. Tara finished in 1st Place at the NFAA Idaho State Indoor Championships on March 5th for Olympic Re-curve in Pocatello, ID. They then traveled to Redding, CA, May 3-5 for the NFAA 3D Nationals where Tara had previously taken the 1st place and was defending her Title. This year she got a 2nd place finish.

Their next travel destination is Dublin, OH, for the US National Target Championship / US Olympic Team Trials stage 1, scheduled for August 15th and 16th.

Let's all think some positive thoughts for Tara Rose's success in her endeavor's.
