

PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGES

ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES

(b) REGULAR LODGE DUES

All lodge dues hereafter specified shall be payable: annually, in advance, on or before April 1 of each year.

The regular lodge dues shall be \$110.00 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Associate dues.

"TO BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS":


(b) REGULAR LODGE DUES

All lodge dues hereafter specified shall be payable: annually, in advance, on or before April 1 of each year

The regular Lodge Dues shall be \$119.50 per year which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Associate dues.

Scholarship

ATTENTION ALL ELKS: IMPORTANT SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

*** The 2019 Legacy Awards Scholarship Competition for college-bound high school seniors who are children and grandchildren, step-children and step grandchildren and/or a legal ward of Elk members in good standing began on September 1. The Elk member must have joined the Elk's before April 1st of 2017. These merit based scholarship awards are in the amount of \$1,000 per year. Applications are available on-line at enf.elks.org/leg. The applicant must take the SAT or Act no later than Dec. 31st. Applications must be submitted on-line on or before January 31st, 2020, 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

***Emergency Educational Grants provide undergraduate financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to \$4,000. Student must attend an accredited U.S. college or university full time (12 semester hours), demonstrate financial need, be unmarried and under the age of 23 as on December 31st in the year of application. Applications are available by request between May 1 and October 31 of the academic year for which assistance is desired. To obtain the application, contact ENF Scholarship Office at 773-755-4732 or scholarship@elks.org . For more information visit enf.elks.org/eeg

***VOCATIONAL GRANTS. (Occupational or Technical Training). (Grants of up to \$2,000 are awarded in California and Hawaii.)
The program is open to any U.S. citizen who requires training or retraining to compete in the work place. It is not limited to high school students and applications may be turned in at any time. Applications are online at www.chea-elks.org (Click on Youth Activities, then select Scholarships and scroll down.)

***UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARHIPS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. This program is a financial need based and academic use scholarship. It is intended for undergraduate work at a licensed vocational school, accredited community college or four year college. Individuals applying must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of California or Hawaii; have a physical, neurological, visual or hearing impairment, and or a speech-language disorder; and be a senior in high school, a high school graduate, or have passed the GED Examination or California High School Proficienty Examination. , Applications are on-line at www.chea-elks.org/youth-activities/scholarships.


