Dear Members,

It's hard to believe that it is nearly the end of summer with the Labor Day weekend just around the corner! Don't forget to fly your flag for the holiday!

As you know, the pandemic has had a significant impact on Lodge activities as well as Lodge revenue. Recently, the House Committee met and developed plans for a limited re-opening of the Lodge within current mandated restrictions. Good news! The Boise Elks Lodge has obtained Central District Health approval to open for restaurant service. We will be open for food service from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday beginning Tuesday, September 1. The menu will be limited but will include personal pizzas, hamburgers, chicken tenders and finger steaks. On Friday, September 4, Bob Apa will offer his renowned clam chowder as a special soup of the day!

To comply with CDH requirements, face coverings are required except when eating while seated at a table. Table capacity is limited to 6 persons. Please note the bar top is closed and only table side service is permitted. Please recognize that we are permitted to open as a restaurant, not a bar. We want you to come in but request that you order from our food menu as we are only permitted to re-open because we are operating as a restaurant. When you come in, help us maintain compliance with the requirements to assure we can remain open. Please also know that your purchase of food will help the Lodge financially. So come in with a big appetite!

Because of the current group size limitations, there will be no scheduled Lodge meetings in September. However, we hope you'll come in and have something to eat and help support the Lodge!

As always, please reach out to me by phone or email with any questions or concerns. If I do not have an answer for you, I will get one!

Legacy Awards

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility requirements are outlined below.

The 2021 contest will open on September 1, 2020.

The deadline for applications is February 5, 2021 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

For the 2021 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2018, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2018, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2021. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.

The applicant must be a high school senior.

The applicant must apply online only. The 2021 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 5, 2021 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.

We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2021 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.

Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.

Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

If you are selected as a 2021 Legacy Awards recipient, you will be required to perform service once a year with an Elks Lodge during the four years you are receiving the scholarship. [Click here](#) for more information about serving with the Elks.

The student must complete and submit the ONLINE application. The 2021 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 5, 2021 at 11:59 a.m. Central Time.

The Elk sponsor's membership will be verified through the BPOE Grand Lodge headquarters.

When a student registers to complete the online application, both the applicant and Lodge Secretary will be notified by email.

Upon receipt of the application, the applicant will receive a notification that the application was received. Winners will be announced in late April 2021.

Note: Because the contest begins in one Lodge year and the winners are announced in the next, a Legacy Award could go to the child or grandchild of a lapsed member. An applicant's Elk parent or grandparent must be a paid-up member in good standing at the time of application, but if the Elk chooses not to renew membership, that decision will not affect the outcome of the Legacy Awards contest.

Elks to retain and recruit

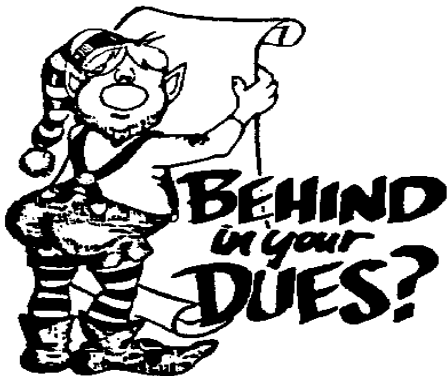
Message from the Grand Exalted Ruler PAUL R. RYAN

This is the time of year to move the momentum for the future of Elkdom. Prepare your Members for what is coming next and create new ideas for the future. There are so many things just around the corner: GER Membership Class, ENF Month, Red Ribbon Week, Patriotism Week, Veterans Day... so many more. Membership: Are you in line with your goals for the year? What? You didn't set goals!?! Then start now and make sure that you are on top of recruiting and retaining membership. This is a superb time to send invoices to your Members who have not paid their dues. The Membership Committee should contact those delinquent Members to ask them to become current. Let them know that the funds continue to help the Lodge do great things in the community. Then, ask them if there is anyone they know who would benefit from becoming a Member of the Lodge and also would enjoy helping with community events and charitable get-togethers. However, don't just retain; ramp up and get new Members in other ways. Hold an event and have each Member bring someone they know who is not a Member. Take a box of goodies to the police departments, fire departments, and sheriff's departments and tell them about our closed-door policies. Tell them how their job and their privacy is important to us. As fall comes in, are you working out details for Lodge participation? It is a good time to organize and gather new ideas. Plant a seed for something new to be done each year, month, or week. It is a good time to organize old and implant new ideas to make sure that something is always happening at the Lodge. This is a great time to make sure that the Lodge Secretary is keeping up with the charitable reports.
