ENF MESSAGE

We received the Freedom Grant of \$2,500 which is being used to purchase welcome home kits for veterans. See Colleen if you can help out in any way with the distribution of these kits.

We also received the Spotlight Grant of \$2,000 which is being used to purchase winter jackets for underprivileged children in our area. These jackets will be given out at the North Brunswick Library on October 31st. See Aimee if you can help with this project.

We were also approved for the Beacon Grant in the amount of \$3,500 for our Feed the Hungry program. We are doing a little something differently this year. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we are starting with a food pantry in October and possibly in February or March of next year and we will also do our regular deliveries for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. We will be applying for the Gratitude Grant in the amount of \$2,000 to be used for our Drug Awareness program. More details to follow.

There is no Promise Grant this year. We have used this in the past for our Halloween for All party. Obviously with the current Covid-19 situation, we were not going to hold that party this year, but we had plans to use it for backpacks for children in our area schools. Unfortunately, that grant is not available.

Thank you again for all your support to ENF. Remember, contributions can be made easily on-line. We are currently at \$2.33 per capita. We have a way to go to reach the Grand Exalted Ruler's per capita of \$4.75. The Gratitude Grant is dependent upon us reaching the GER's per capita. So please send in what you can. Even \$5 or \$10 is appreciated and will go towards our per capita.

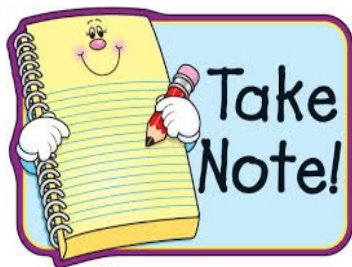

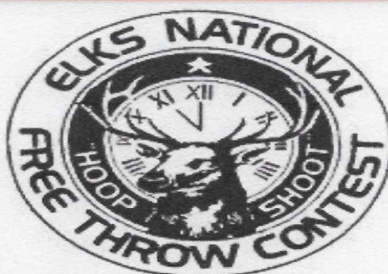
