This is a great time to have (safe) gatherings outside the Lodges for friends, families, and people who you can get interested in joining this super organization. We will take any Members,

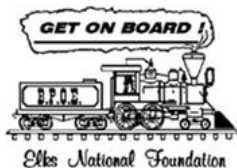
but young ones will Create Momentum for the Future of Elksdom.

If you are one of these members, please stop by the office Monday through Thursday between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. or mail your additional \$15.00 to the Lodge.

If you still owe the entire dues amount and wish to pay by credit card, please refer to the link on your dues statement. Again, dues for the 2021-2022 fraternal year is \$165.00. In May, delinquent members will receive a reminder statement from the Grand Lodge. We did work with Grand Lodge to ensure that the dues statement will have the correct amount noted.

Once we begin to reopen the South Bar be sure to check for your empty Purple Pig on the credenza just outside of the South Bar.



We are getting quite the sounder of pigs. When you turn in your full Purple Pig, the office or Major Project/Purple Pig Chair will count your donation, prepare a receipt and place your empty Purple Pig on the credenza. This is where they corral as they wait to be picked up and refilled.

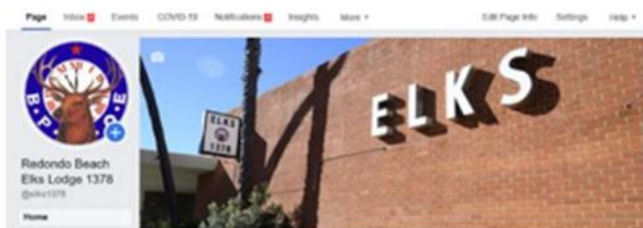
