Harold Kott Celebrates His 100th Birthday



Harold Kott celebrated his 100th Birthday recently and is the only original charter member of Flat Rock Elks Lodge still with us today. Up until last year before Covid restrictions you would find Harold attending most of the events that supported this lodge. During such events as Inaugural Ball, Wild Game Dinner, Fish Fry's and special events the entertainment committee would hold Harold was always there. Whenever I got a chance to talk to him he would always have a story to tell me about the lodge.

When the Flat Rock Elks was founded in 1947, Harold married a Mortician's daughter and was told by his father-in-law he would be joining the Elks. At that time they were looking for members to join and that's how he became one of the original charter members. Harold, along with two lady helpers would prepare the Fish Fry Dinners that also included Frog Legs. They would arrive early to prep lettuce, peppers and to wrap potatoes here at the Lodge. Harold tells of the fun days of dances being held in the current upper lodge meeting room and playing poker in the back room.

When Harold Celebrated his 96th Birthday he told me he has had a "Good Life". He remembers as far back as 1939 going to school at Port Creek School with one teacher and about 25 students and walking two miles to and from school in very cold weather. Being the son of a farmer and working hard on the farm he thinks that's the reason he has always been considered a "Good Helper". Harold worked for the Ford Motor Company for two years and actually met and shook hands with Henry Ford. He spent four years serving our country in the Navy and worked over 30 years for Edison. While working at Edison he was able to help save the lives of two fellow employees that almost died from being exposed to Argon Gas. Harold was also a member of Kiwanis where he had served as President, Treasurer and Trustee.

No "Pot of Gold" for Flat Rock Elks

We hope that this finds you happy and healthy as we transition into the better part of Michigan's spring weather. The last month has had a flurry of activity with repairs and required repairs and maintenance to our Lodge. Just a quick overview of some of the major projects finished or underway currently.

- Main sewer line from the bar, social lounge which was 75 years old collapsed/ failed. A respected plumber Frank Clark of Flat Rock was hired to access and complete the following actions.
- Tim Campau and his crew carefully removed the awnings and handrails at the front entrance.
- The concrete and stairway were removed and dug out, the drain replaced/ repaired, and the access clean out relocated for easy access in the future.
- New concrete was poured for the entrance walkway and stairs and Tim Campau and his crew from Wayne Craft reinstalled the awning and replaced the handrails with a modern and attractive upgrade.
- Additionally, a drain in the bar storage room was failing and not up to code and that was replaced as well.
- There is still an issue with drainage under the bar floor. We are investigating possible options for a repair at the time of this letter writing. Updates will be forthcoming.
- The Trustees meet with the insurance adjuster and we are awaiting their settlement report.
- I want to thank all our Trustees and Board for working together collectively for the benefit of the Lodge members and looking after the interest of our building and assets.
- The City of Flat Rock has a federal matching grant of up to \$10,000 in exterior updates for businesses and organizations in the city. We are applying for that grant and are taking bids of exterior repairs and repainting and lighting updates. While not guaranteed we will make every effort to obtain it.
- The ice machine in the bar was repaired recently.

As you can see even with planning and maintenance, unforeseen expenses and major and minor repairs do happen without notice. It is the nature of a 75-year-old building. Whenever possible/ practical we do as much in-house work as we can. Long term expenses like roofing, the parking lot, kitchen equipment and general maintenance will continue to require increased expenditures.

Being active and participating in events, fundraisers, dinners, golf, raffles are appreciated and a necessary part of what being a member of the Elks is all about. Having a building that not just our members, but the community at large can be proud of is critical for long term success. As the world reopens be active, please. Everyone has something to contribute, time, talent, money. Stay safe and Healthy!
