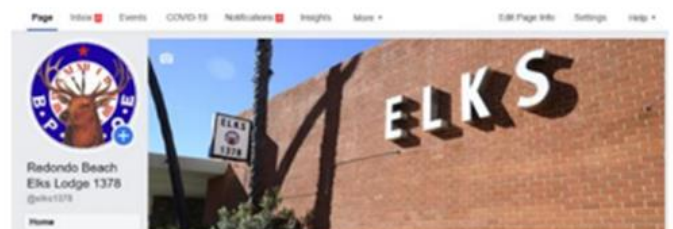

### IN MEMORIAM

#### Freda Oswalt

Born: October 27, 1955  
Initiated: January 22, 2019  
Died: May 19, 2021



Freda was born in New Hampshire and her family moved to Virginia where they opened a pizza restaurant. This restaurant was eventually turned into a successful nightclub with headliners like Wolfman Jack and The Coasters. This likely is how her mother was cast in Patsy Cline's biopic and Freda honed in on her amazing social gifts.

She attended the Fashion Institute of Design Management (FIDM), bartended at the Anza Inn for 20 years, and was the Hospitality Lead for Inservice Amtrak trains. Freda loved horses and was very proud of her riding. Always open to try new things, she went sky diving, SCUBA diving, and belonged to a tap-dancing troupe. 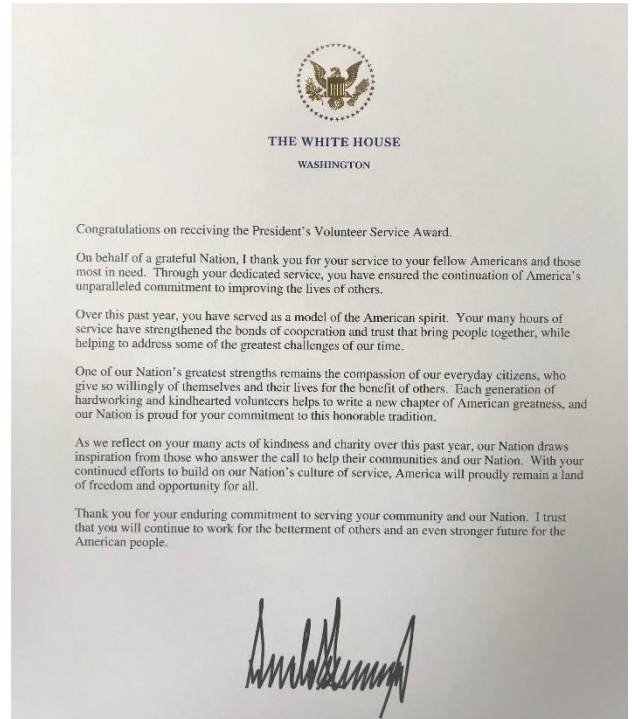
