Looking ahead, we have several items on the agenda:

August 5th, Camp ASCCA (our State Major Project) hosts Elks' Day. All Elks are invited to attend to see the camp in action! I can assure you that your heart will be touched.

Facebook had several posts concerning "**the sale**". Some reminisced about days gone by when the pool was packed, when reservations were required for dinner in our restaurant, and the very popular **Sunday buffet** was the talk of the town. I too, remember when there was standing room only in the Club, when the Drifters played in concert, when Elvis came to the Lodge, when Fred and Chris Wright packed the Club...

I was especially troubled by some of the negative comments from some who claim to have been members... and some who had a negative experience at our Lodge. We probably earned some of these comments but would have hoped these would not have found a voice on the internet.

Seventeen months ago, I offered to run for Exalted Ruler of the Lodge and set out to try to change some of the negative aspects... I believe we have made progress even though it was difficult getting members to come out during the pandemic. Our current **active members**, while few in numbers, are working to change many of the issues alluded to in the several Facebook posts.

Our members have tried to spruce up our building even though parts of it are over fifty years old. They have painted and cleaned up the Lodge. They work weekly to maintain the pool. The Board has replaced defective kitchen equipment and replaced five commercial AC Units to make the building livable. The Lodge holds an annual **New Year's Eve dance** and an **Annual Anniversary Ball** to recognize our members. Impromptu gatherings in the Club will be found on St Patty's Day, Cinco de Mayo, Halloween, and Christmas. There is an **annual Luau at the pool on Memorial Day** with a DJ "on the deck" and we close the pool season with an "End of Summer – Blowout." This year, a **First Annual Cornhole tournament**, in conjunction with the **Blowout**, is planned. And to raise money for **Camp ASCCA (our State Major Project)**, a "**Battle of the Burger**" is planned for August 14th...

Thanks to our members (**Hal and Rose**!), there is karaoke on the second and fourth Fridays of each month with the Club open every Friday evening as long as there are members present... Our club prices are better than most places in town. For non-Members, while they may visit the Club and Pool, they are asked to consider membership in the Lodge.

We have <u>a cooking team of members</u> who have helped with specials throughout the year... from Shrimp dinners, Steak Nights in the Club, to Catfish fries, Bar-b-cued butts and some of the best Brunswick stew served in East Alabama for Independence Day, they have done it all. The Butts, Stew, and Fish fries are fund raisers to provide for the **local scholarships awarded to Southern Union students** each year.

While there is a social aspect to our group, we are not just a bar – we are a charitable fraternity. Annually, with help from the **Elks National Foundation**, the Lodge has been able to provide a local food ministry with needed equipment to further their contribution to our community. The Lodge provided a Christmas for local foster children - to let them know that people in the community care. Our Veterans are supported by the **Elks Veteran's Service Commission** with monthly contributions at the VA Medical Center (**thank you Mike Rivers**) and for Veterans Day, we make sure **our Veterans are not forgotten**... with a collection of toiletries and a meal to honor them.

We look for community projects each year to support victims of abuse, further the efforts of those organizations providing services to the needy and provide wholesome activities for youth. We sponsor a **Cub Scout Pack, a Boy Scout Troop, and a Girl Scout Troop**. We also support annually, the **Elks National Hoop Shoot competition**, in which we try developing "gritty children".

Since we are a patriotic organization, with a salute to our Flag we honor and celebrate **Flag Day** each year! We honor our moms with a **Mother's Day Service**, remember our fathers on **Father's Day** and honor our departed members in a special **Memorial Service** each year. Our **POW/MIA service members** will be honored in a remembrance service on September 20th.

And Elks take care of our own.


