

Another year of the Most Valuable Scholarship competition has been completed. This is a nationwide program that begins with administration on the local level. Students apply on line for scholarships in competition with their local peers, statewide peers and nationally. At the local level each Lodge recognizes the top three achieving young women and the top three achieving young men in their community. At our Lodge, we provide each of the six students with \$500 scholarships and advance them through District, State and National level judging where they can be eligible for up to \$60,000 in scholarships. Our six winners this year are: Payton Bucki, Caroline Groll, Ava Pervam, Dawood Virk, Alexander Stewart, and Logan Lundgren.

Although our scholarship is officially known as the "Most valuable Student" scholarship, I personally feel it should be identified as the "Most valuable person" scholarship because the criteria for selection go well beyond scholarship. All applicants are judged on seven separate merit-based standards including excellence in the classroom; leadership skills; community service; employment activities; athletics and extracurricular activities; and the all-important essay (in prior years ACT and SAT scores were also considered but this year it was eliminated due to the decision by many colleges to waive the standardized tests due to health concerns associated with mass testing during the pandemic). To win one of our awards the student must be an intelligent, caring, well rounded young adult who has been placed in leadership roles by his or her peers. Our scholarship winners represent the three highest achieving young men and three highest achieving young women from throughout our community which includes 17 different private and public high schools covering all of Monroe County and a large portion of Southern Wayne County. Our winners included three valedictorians (five in total applied). Most importantly we were able to recognize six fine young men and women who have served their communities and fellow students through multiple charitable activities and leadership roles at their schools.

The competition in our Lodge alone was very rigorous. Three of our six students advanced through District level competition to the State Level and two of the boys were award winners at the State Level and advanced to National scoring. This is a group we should all be proud of.

Special thanks go out to the Members of the Scholarship Committee who took valuable time away from their busy holiday schedules back in December to evaluate and score dozens of applications. Those Members are Carol Wallace, Tammy Steffen and Brian Marvaso. Without their help, the program would not be possible.

It was a sunny, hot, dry day and we still had 75 cars and a few motorcycles. It was a great show for sure.


A big thank you to the cooks and the bar attendant. The food was delicious. It was a group effort and everyone did a great job. Let;s hope for another good show for 2022.


