No Kids without a Christmas

We would like to thank everyone that made The No Kids Without a Christmas project such a success again this year. There are literally hundred's of people that play some kind role in helping to create the magic that this annual event provides every year to families in need - golfers, sponsors, donors, volunteers, the caterer, Wesburn Golf & Country Club, the sign maker, Flat Rock Meijer, shoppers, shoppers and more shoppers.....the list goes on and on! Hopefully we have created something that makes everyone proud to be a part of such a special community.

This year we were able to provide a Christmas for 65 children from 27 families. These families came from several downriver communities (Flat Rock, Woodhaven, Huron, Brownstown and Southgate). Since we started this journey in 2017, we have been able to provide a Christmas for 193 children from

78 families!

This year, we were also able to make a significant contribution towards a service dog for Emery, a 2 year old girl who suffers from a rare genetic mutation causing epilepsy, developmental delay and learning disabilities. She has seizures sometimes occurring hundreds of times per day. The service dog will be trained to sense and warn of seizures before they happen so that proper precautions can be taken and help to improve Emery's and her family's quality of life. The total cost to train and provide the dog to the family is between \$40,000 - \$60,000 and takes around 2.0 - 2.5 years after the fundraising is complete. We are happy to report that the family has been accepted into the program and will receive the service dog sometime in 2024! This may be the most special Christmas gift that we have been able to help with and makes everything that we do well worth the efforts!

Members All,

We hope everyone had a blessed Christmas and Holiday Season. Like all of you, your Lodges Trustees and Board of Directors are looking forward to seeing this difficult time through and having better days ahead. We certainly encourage you to be a part of all that your lodge has to offer both in terms of fun and fellowship, but even more importantly all the good works we do for Vets, 365 Special Needs Children, Elks National Foundation and so much more. As you plan your year, make sure to make a point of including Lodge events as a part of your life.

As you may know this year, 2022, marks the 75th Anniversary of our Lodge which is a wonderful milestone. Our Building even with prior planning and preventative maintenance is going to have unforeseen repairs, major and minor. As your Trustees we take this seriously and make every effort to act as needed to keep costs manageable, necessary and avoid the 'kicking the can down the road" approach.

December saw some additional and necessary plumbing work in addition to what was completed earlier in 2021. Fort Street Plumbing was hired to clean up and repair/reline drains with an epoxy lining to correct what was failing. This process avoided a very major, expensive and disruptive replacement which would have included digging and other considerations. They did a very professional and thorough job with minimal disruptions to the membership. Big thanks to Treasurer, Big Al Kowalewski, for taking the time to help research this technique and share his expertise.

You may have noticed the new bright and clear illumination of your Lodge building and parking area. Fellow member Jerry Kupser, a lighting expert, volunteered his services to plan and replace our outdated exterior building lighting. This not only will save considerable money in the long run on our Utility bill but is superior to what we had. The LED bulbs last 12 plus years on average and are much clearer and brighter. Jerry has some additional work to be completed closer to Spring. This saved the Lodge considerable monies! Please thank Jerry and his assistants, PER Kenny Cesta and Lecturing Knight Jeff Weiler, for volunteering in the cold weather for everyone's benefit. When the Building is painted in the Spring it will help showcase Elk pride to our community.

Remember Membership meetings are held the first and third Wednesday at 7.30 pm. This is where official Lodge business is conducted, and you can ask questions, participate and get the real story firsthand. Trustee/ Board meetings the second Wednesday at 7.30 pm.





ELK HISTORY YOU MAY NOT KNOW



The Order of Elks was formally organized February 16,1868, in the City of New York. Its full corporate name is "Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America." Its declared purposes are to practice its four cardinal virtues, Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; and to cultivate good fellowship.

The animal from which the Order took its name was chosen because a number of its attributes were deemed typical of those to be cultivated by members of the fraternity. The elk is distinctively an American animal. It habitually lives in herds. The largest of our native quadrupeds, it is yet fleet of foot and graceful in movement. It is quick and keen of perception; and while it is usually gentle and even timorous, it is strong and valiant in defense of its own.

A representation of the majestic head of the male, with its spreading antlers, was adopted as the first badge of the Order; and is still the most conspicuous element of its copyrighted; fraternal emblem.
