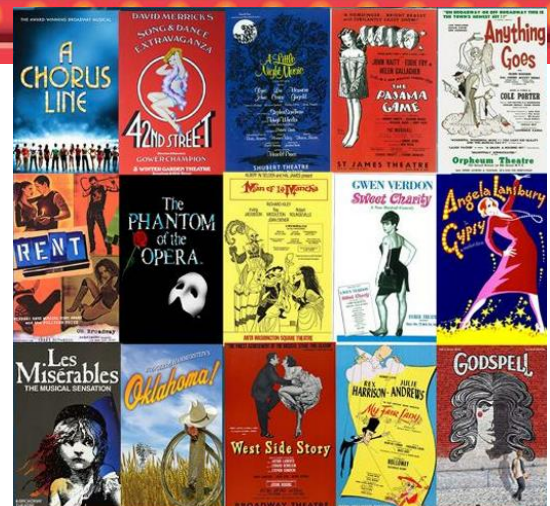

President John F. Kennedy wrote that the Founding Fathers made an appropriate choice when they selected the bald eagle as the emblem of the nation. The fierce beauty and proud independence of this great bird symbolizes the strength and freedom of America.

The Second Continental Congress selected the Bald Eagle as the U. S. National Symbol on June 20, 1782. Historians agree that the eagle is often used as an emblem of great governments, as a solar symbol, linked to all sky gods. It signifies inspiration, release from bondage, victory, longevity, speed, and pride. The image of the eagle bestows freedom and the courage to look to the future. The eagle is symbolic of the importance of honesty and truthful principles.

The First Americans, our Esteemed Native Heritage, have extensively connected with the eagle since very ancient times. It is widely regarded as the chief of the birds. Its flight takes it highest into the sky toward the Sun and the Great Mystery, the Creator. Its large, black and white feathers are widely used for articles of honor. An eagle feather is often used in blessing someone by fanning them or touching them with the feather.

Traditional American stories began before there were people, when eagles soared in the heavens. There are legends among the Pueblo nations of the southwest, such as the Zuni, of a boy who becomes an eagle. They are central to the sagas of the Iroquois League of Peace. Countless stories live among the First Americans that show great respect and awe for the eagle.

What was your first sighting of a Bald Eagle in free, soaring flight, high in the sky? I distinctly remember mine: grandly floating over Big Bear Lake on July 4,

2019. I have also watched them swoop to catch fish in the Channel Islands.

The life of Bald Eagles is a marvelous one to share with the family. A captivating website allows all of us to experience an eagle family in nature. At the moment, the eagle family in Big Bear has a (large) baby and we are blessed to watch it grow. The second event is Armed Services Day held on Saturday, May 21. In 1949, Defense Secretary Louis Johnson presented an idea to create one single day to celebrate the unification of the armed forces under the Department of Defense, instead of celebrating each separately. Schedule an event to honor all active armed services members. Invite them to the Lodge, provide them a meal, and show our support for all they do for us and our country.

Then comes Memorial Day, held on Monday, May 30. This day is for honoring the men and women who have given the ultimate sacrifice for our country while in the United States military. In the years following the Civil War, it was originally known as Decoration Day. By the late 1860s, Americans in towns and cities started holding springtime tributes to the countless fallen soldiers from this conflict by decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers. It became an official federal holiday in 1971.

We now not only honor our fallen United States service men and women, but also family members who have passed on. We hold family gatherings and parades to unofficially mark the beginning of summer.

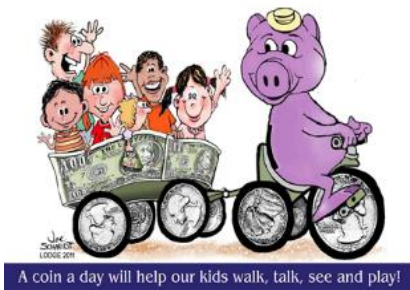


**A Message from CHEMPI Chairperson,

He loved to sing with church choirs and Los Cancienenos Master Chorale. He played tennis until he was 87. Ray expressed himself through sermons and poetry, self-publishing two books of selected poems and an autobiography. SENIOR BENEFITS

SENIOR PARKING METER PERMIT: If you are 62 or older and drive a car currently registered in California, you can purchase a parking meter permit for \$25.00. The permit allows you to PARK FOR FREE in City Lot 4 adjacent to the North side of the Lodge and the Esplanade parking lot in front of the Lodge – between the Lodge and South Catalina Avenue. You can obtain an application or go directly to Redondo Beach City Hall at 415 Diamond Street and ask for an application.

REDONDO BEACH ELKS SOUTH PARKING LOT

Elks Members are welcome to use the South Parking Lot when our Lodge is not open, and when the parking lot is not rented out. Place your valid membership card on the dashboard of your car. This will allow us to identify non-members using our parking spaces and take appropriate action.
