Recently the Newark Elks Lodge received a Beacon Grant in the amount of \$6,000. \$4.000 was allocated for the purchase of equipment such as car seats, strollers, inflatable beds, etc., for families in crisis. The Elks purchased the needed items for the Survivors Advocacy Center who, in turn, distributed them to families in need. The remaining \$2,000 was used to purchase food for the Food Closet, which will be distributed by the staff there.






