

Pursuant to the Elks National Grand Lodge Statues in *Section 15.070:* Special Meetings may be called by the Exalted Ruler upon three days' notice to all Members of the Lodge.

The notice shall state the special business to be considered such as initiating candidates, and no other business shall be considered or transacted.

The notice can be sent out via email or placed on the Lodge bulletin board. Since there is no voting or other business, the Exalted Ruler has the authority to call the Special Meeting.

More to follow as we try to press ahead to initiate all of our outstanding candidates...

Veterans were on our minds in November! See Cheri's article...We supported a number of Veterans related ceremonies during the month in honor of Veterans Day. We collected personal care items for Vets from our friends at Holy Spirit during their schoolwide assembly. We also handed out U.S. flags, flag pins, and patriotic stickers to students. Heading into year-end, we plan to spend grant funds to give back to our Veterans in need in a big way. Stay tuned! We are now planning a Veterans Stand Down event in March 2023.



As we all celebrate Thanksgiving, let us all remember how well off we are as Elks. I would say that most members are fairly comfortable and enjoy a happy life. As ENF chairman, the ENF has also much to be thankful for from Rensselaer Lodge 2073. We have achieved some of the goals we set in the beginning of the Lodge year, with others reachable with a little more effort.

We have donated \$5,295 so far this year with a goal of \$6,610 for the Lodge, which would give us a \$10 per member giving total. We now stand at \$8.01 per member. We have passed our one goal of 15% of membership giving. We have added 4 new members to the Fidelity Club.

BUT, we still need more members to donate. We ideally would like old members of ENF to renew their donations, new members of ENF and at least a donation of \$10, but again if you can afford it, a donation of \$50 or more gets us closer to our goals as a Lodge. So of course, we are asking you to dig deep if you are not a member and join the almost 20% of membership and donate at least \$10, but hope-

fully a bit more.

Houston, We Have a Problem



Veterans Remembrance— Robert E. "Bob" Miller

We celebrate the life and times of Robert E. "Bob" Miller, who was born on July 15, 1945, in Moores, New York. After completing his academic studies, Bob enlisted in the United States Army on December 30th, 1963, at Troy, New York. After completing his basic training, Private Miller received airborne training and was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division as a paratrooper. The 10st Airborne Division is a light infantry division that specializes in air assault operations. It can plan, coordinate, and execute multiple battalion-size aerosol operations to seize terrain. These operations can be conducted by mobile teams covering large distances, fighting behind enemy lines, and working in severe environments with limited or degraded infrastructure. It's unique battlefield mobility and high level of training have kept it in the front line of US land combat forces in recent conflicts.



Private Miller was assigned to USAREUR for a little over 2 1/2 years, with his last duty assignment and major command with Company B, 1st battalion, 509th Infantry Regiment (Airborne). Since they were first used in World War II, paratroopers have earned the reputation for their audacity, resourcefulness, cunning and lethality. Airborne units have been called upon to execute rapid strikes, often far behind enemy lines. Their training and missions are some of the most arduous in the military. In the United States Army, renowned units like the 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions have guarded and reinforced this tradition. Largely overlooked in the pantheon of these divisions is the 509th Infantry, nicknamed "Geronimo", an independent airborne infantry unit which over its history has endured some of the most brutal engagements during wartime. On April 12, 1868, previous Miller was honorably discharged from the United States Army at Fort Dix, New Jersey. For his honorable service to his country, Private Miller was awarded the National Defense Service Medal. Upon his honorable discharge from the United States Army, Bob returned to civilian life and was married. He later developed a passion for boxing and training fighters at his gym, Uncle Sam's Boxing Club. In 2015, Bob was inducted into the New York State Boxing Hall of Fame. He leaves behind his wife, is children, and a number of grandchildren.

For those of you who are interested, here is an update on where we stand with the All American Lodge Contest:

Membership Goal: We have hit our initial goal for a gain in membership of +10% or at least 728 Members, up from 661 on March 31, 2022. With that being said, we need to keep bringing in new Members, and we need to pick up Members off the dropped list in order to hit our stretch goal of 800 Members. It is crucial that we bring in all the current candidates too.

Delinquency Goal: We are shooting for 6 or fewer delinquent Members by March 31st, 2023. We are currently at 22. To accomplish this, we need sponsors to contact your people and persuade them to pay their dues this year. This is a tough one, but I think we can make some further progress.

Elks National Foundation (ENF) Goals: To those of you have donated, a sincere thank you is warranted. We are in sight of our goal. Currently, our Lodge is in first place in New York state and seventh



overall in our size category (451—700 members) across the country in the ENF Chairman's Challenge. This is a great mark so far but we need to keep pressing.




ENF Myth Busters

MYTH: When member or donation information is entered into CLMS, the ENF automatically receives the updates/has access to the CLMS data. TRUTH: This is false! CLMS is the membership database system of the Elks and the Grand Lodge--it is not utilized or accessible by the Elks National Foundation. Any donations with dues must be entered in CLMS and then transmitted to the ENF following the instructions on the CLMS Remittance Form for Dues Donations. Address updates, name changes, etc. must be sent to the ENF also, as we do not have access to that system.

Myth: The ENF only spends the interest of the Endowment Fund. Truth: The spending policy was updated in 2009 when the Foundation incorporated. The ENF annually spends 5% of the average of the last 12 quarters. So, depending on the growth or loss in the Endowment Fund, this could be more or less than the interest. This spending policy ensures proper funding for ENF programs year after year.

Myth: Only donations collected at the Lodge count toward Per-Member-



recognition Truth: Almost all donations--regardless of how they were collected--count toward Per-Member-Giving and
