

WOW! What a GREAT year for our Lodge ENF support. When I set the goal for our Lodge back in March for this year's ENF support, I thought I had a small hope of achieving what I thought were lofty goals. This was before I knew of Exalted Ruler Greg Collins goal of ALL AMERICAN LODGE. I set a goal of raising \$6,610, which is \$10.00 per member. As it turns out, we have surpassed those lofty goals. As of this date, we have raised \$7,649.50, which translates to \$11.57 per member. Membership support is at 24.51%.

Our Lodge has received \$21,000.00 in Community Investment Grants. To all members who have donated, THANK YOU! 


