Lodge Secretary for the Elks Year 23-24.

The Lodge Secretary is one of several very important positions in our Lodge. The most important aspect of this position is having the time to the job. It is not a full-time position, however, during certain times of the year it may seem like full-time.

The secretary must attend all Lodge meetings for recording minutes of the meeting, reading of previous minutes and providing Lodge with various administrative information. Outside of meetings the secretary is responsible for receipt of all monies due to the Lodge which is accounted for and pass to the Lodge Treasurer. Issues membership cards and manages all aspects of membership accounting. Receives and communicates to the membership all correspondence. Attendance of District and State Association meetings. Maintains lists of committee membership lists and all changes related to the officers of the Lodge. Many of the record keeping and database management can be done remotely.

Lodge Treasurer for the Elks Year 23-24

The Lodge Treasurer is one of several very important positions in our Lodge. It is critical that the Treasurer have a working knowledge of Quickbooks (QB) and basic accounting/bookkeeping skills.

The duties include: receipt of all Lodge monies from the Secretary, giving them a receipt for the monies and, the receipt of these monies will be recorded in QB using GAAP rules, monies deposited in the bank, keeping a correct account, under their proper dates, of the amounts and sources of receipts and the amounts and purposes of disbursements, taking proper vouchers for the various items, present a report at each regular meeting showing the condition of the funds of the Lodge.



The New Board of Directors

Our Lodge was officially incorporated on October 4, 2022. The first meeting was in December. The board meetings will continue to be held on the third Tuesday of each month, which was the meeting time for the Trustees. Our members are welcome to attend these meetings

The Elks Grand Lodge requires the board be made up of the Exalted Ruler, the Leading Knight, the Loyal Knight, the Lecturing Knight, the Trustees, the Lodge Secretary and the Lodge Treasurer. An 11 member board. While the Board of Directors assume the duties of the Trustees, it was agreed to at the first meeting that the trustees will continue to meet as they had been, prior to the Lodge meetings, and continue to review the bills against the Lodge on behalf of the board.

After Paul Amundsen who had been leading the Lodge incorporation effort, filed all the incorporation paperwork, more approvals were needed from Grand Lodge, and the state of Delaware before the incorporation was finalized. There are needed name changes for the Lodge on official documents and other formalities.

The board will be responsible for the budget and other responsibilities include Lodge property, buildings, investments etc., much of which is under oversight of the Grand Lodge. At the first meeting the board elected it's Chairman, Jim Morris, it's Board Secretary, Jean Amundsen, and it's Vice Chairman, Paul Amundsen.

At the second meeting in January, the board was introduced to the current Lodge budget and as the new Elk year approaches, the budget planning for next year is already underway. I hope to continue to keep our members informed periodically with board updates.







We are now in the month of February and the last 2 months of our Elks fiscal year; ending March 31st.

It is critical that we get our ENF donations in and Fidelity Club Memberships initiated before March 31st for them to be included in the 2022-2023 Elks fiscal year. 


