This will be a different type of article from me. Our Bulletin Editor PER Ramona Mishaga asked me to write about how and why I became an Elk, so here goes.

I first heard of the Elks in the summer of 1974 after my Dad had become a member. I was just a young man in those days. I worked one street over from the old Willow Drive address on Gasmer Street. At that point in my career with Southwestern Bell, I was climbing poles and installing phones. After Dad joined the Lodge I would meet him at the Lodge for a few cold beverages. My Dad was a great believer in paying your own way and asked me what I thought of the Lodge and would I be interested in joining. My reply was how much does it cost? Base pay for an Installer

back in those days was less than five dollars an hour. Dad replied not to worry about that since I had a birthday coming in a few months. He offered to pay my Initiation Fee and six months dues and then I would be on my own. I gratefully accepted his offer and was initiated into the Lodge on September 24, 1974.

When I became a member I knew nothing about the Elks and what we do and stand for. I joined to be able to drink reasonably priced cold beverages with my Dad and play cards in the card room. Well, I was initiated on Tuesday and was dealing for the Lodge on Friday. The more I came to the Lodge the more I observed and learned about our Great Order. Somehow my youth and interest became apparent to our then Exalted Ruler, Buddy Ferguson who was in need of an Esquire and approached me about taking on that office. I did and finished out the 1974 – 1975 Lodge year as Esquire. I then served the next year as Esquire, then started through the chairs, Becoming Exalted Ruler in 1979. Since that time I have held numerous offices and positions in the Elks, none more rewarding than the current two. That is as your Lodge Secretary and as District Leader for the Gulf Coast. My almost 50 years as an Elk has been rewarding and enjoyable and remains the best Birthday Present ever received.

Remember, it all started over a cold beverage after work. This illustrates that you can get out of our Lodge what you put into it. Not all Elks want to be officers, and that's OK. There are so many ways to get involved and help. My Dad, never served a day as an officer, but was one heck of a worker bee. He was even awarded the great honor of Elk of the Year.

I hope this hasn't bored you too much, but the message is meant to be get out and get involved.


