Pleasantville School Food Pantry. This year’s **Gratitude Grant** includes a **\$1500** bonus **thanks to the generosity of your, our members**, in meeting ENF targets for Member Participation, Chair Challenge and Fidelity Club membership, . This **\$3500** grant is for the food pantry at Pleasantville School. We established the pantry several years ago and recently purchased a new freezer so that hungry children are fed.

Helping Our Veterans!


Freedom Grant. This **\$3,000** grant is to provide a series of special, catered meals to elderly veterans at the Community Living Center at the VA Hospital in Wilmington. Spotlight Grant. This **\$2000** grant to is to provide “Welcome Home Kits” to assist homeless veterans who are transitioning into housing. Each kit has various household, kitchen, and paper items.


