change forever.

On September 11, 2001, our country was attacked not once, not twice, but four times in less than 90 minutes. Planes collided with the two towers of the World Trade Center, a plane rammed the Pentagon and one plane crashed in a field in Pennsylvania. The four planes had been hijacked by a total of 19 terrorists. Over 3300 people lost their lives in the attack, which included 343 NYC police officers and firefighters. This was, indeed, a devastating day for the United States.

The attack did not destroy the country. It roused our people to pull together, to support each other during this tragic time. In fact it made the nation stronger and more united.

On September 9th, the lodge will hold a First Responders Appreciation Night. We will remember that fateful day, while we honor our local police officers, firefighters and EMTs with a free spaghetti dinner(\$10 for non-first responders) and a short ceremony, followed by DJ music.

As you can see Scholarship has a new logo for our Gazette. I discovered this great logo when I did some research on the My Elks app. If you have not looked at the My Elks app go to www.my-elks.com and you will find many other applications that will save you time.

However, this month's article is all about scholarships and we have a few to tell you about. The Most Valuable Student scholarship application has been open to graduating high school seniors since August 1. The deadline for the applications is November 13, 2023. Applications are available at enf.elks.org/MVS (ONLY available ONLINE) Legacy Scholarship applications open up September 1, 2023. The deadline for applications is February 5, 2024. This scholarship is open to children and grandchildren of Elks

in good standing. New this year: SAT and ACT scores are not required. 2024 Legacy recipients will be required to perform *three* instances of Service with an Elks Lodge

during the four years they are receiving their scholarship. Please visit enf.elks.org/leg to apply.

The Oregon State Elks Association funds five Vocational Grants every year at \$2,000 each. There is no age restriction on who may apply and is open to anyone who would like to apply. They are to be used only for vocational or technical schooling and may not be used as a stepping stone to a four-year program. For more information, go to: Oregonelks.org. You will find the application under What We Do/Scholarship/OSEA Vocational Grant. Deadline is March 1, 2024.


