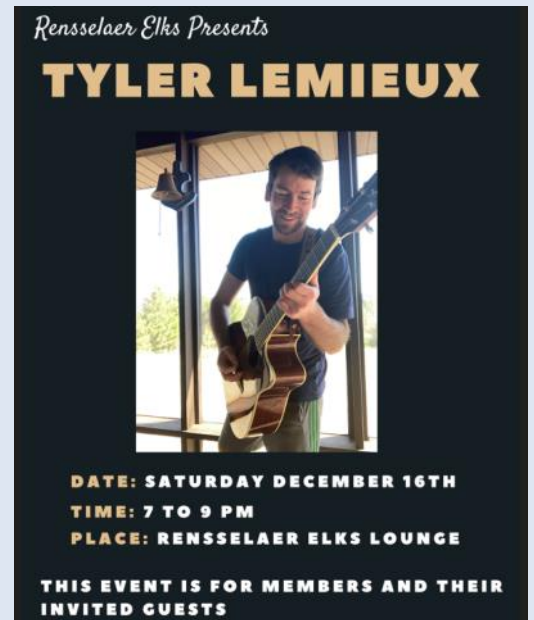
The final drawings, to be held the night of the Dinner/Auction, November 18th, we shall select:

Rensselaer Lodge delivered 411 dictionaries to the following schools. Holy Spirit received 15. Citizen Genet had 80 students receive their own books. Red Mill was the happy recipient of 75 dictionaries. We went to the Castleton elementary school and gave 60 happy students their own dictionary. Our trip to the Donald P. Sutherland elementary school in Nassau saw us deliver 31 more books to happy 3rd graders. Rensselaer elementary saw us deliver 80 more dictionaries to those students. And Green Meadow elementary was our last stop delivering 70 dictionaries to a great bunch of students.

In fact, all the 3rd grade students we interacted with were very excited to receive their own dictionary which they can add to their own library. The main hall canopy entrance and member entrances should allow entry from the street and back entrance from the rear. All parking spots must be cleared for a vehicle to park appropriately. Snow must not be plowed against building or back garage.

Because of prior damage to Lodge property, \$500 will be withheld until winter ends. Marking stakes are encouraged.

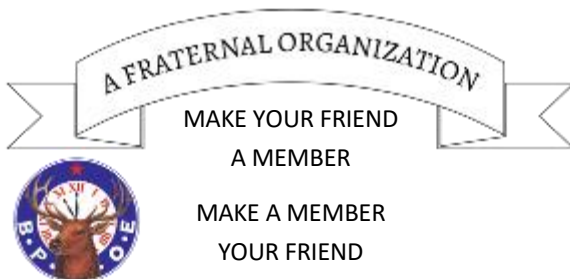
