



This program started in 1982 but we need it now more than ever in our community. I work at a treatment center in Angleton called Serenity Light and my job is to help people find treatment options but sometimes it's too late. We must educate teens and young adults that fake pills are on the streets that look like other drugs and one pill can kill. Know that if you volunteer on this committee you can actually play a part in saving lives!




