The Can Company

For those who aren't aware, here on the lodge grounds and hidden behind the RV Park's cabana is the lodge's very own aluminum can recycling center.

Around 1995, the recycling station was constructed and entered into service under the management of the RV Club, also known as the Wapiti Nomads. At that time, there were about 20 members.

The first can crushing machine put into service was built by Ed Stuck which worked well until about 2003 when Gary Jondle stepped up and built a new and improved crusher which is still in use today.

In the beginning, the can recycling brought in around \$1000 annually to the lodge's general fund. Anything above the \$1000 went to the direct use by the RV club for their activities.

To date, the machine is working like a fine clock! Only a few minor adjustments from time to time are needed and the machine remains ready for action whenever enough aluminum cans and manpower can be assembled to warrant its use.

Our very small group of loyal volunteers collect cans not only from this lodge, but from several local businesses who appreciate our help in lessoning their need to haul cans at their personal time and expense to the county. Once a large enough pile exists here at the lodge, we get a team together and crush, then load them into trucks and trailers and head off to Tacoma or other collection points to cash them in.

Although the extreme fluctuations in the value of aluminum is hard to predict, we have been able to make a tidy little profit to help fund special projects, like the vintage Elks sign mounted on the front of our lodge. Bringing this old beauty back to life has been our focus with the funds we are able to collect by aluminum recycling.

Please, save your bagged aluminum cans and consider dropping them here at the lodge, behind the cabana in the back of the RV park any time. We'll put them to good use for the enjoyment of all of our members.
