Sebring Elks Lodge #1529 started the new year off right. We had wonderful meals and games while enjoying time with our Elks family. February will be even better because we have a lot of great opportunities for everyone to join in on some fun events. Keep looking at the calendars hanging in the hall as you enter the Lodge for the days and times for these events happening around the Lodge. Steak night this month will be moved to the 16th and will include a special Valentines Day theme everyone please join us for a nice meal, just watch out for Cupid, he can be very sneaky! Our Pork Ribeye meal has become a huge favorite among diners at the Lodge so we have made this months meal into an ENF Fundraiser! Each year Elks National requires each lodge to contribute \$4.80 per member in order to qualify to receive ENF grant money to distribute to our community through local community projects. Often times our lodge does not get the needed donations from our members to meet the required amounts. Our kitchen manager Christie Spiegel has agreed to take \$5.00 per person from the proceeds of the Pork Ribeye meal and put it toward a great cause for our Lodge and community. The meal will still only cost you \$15.00 but we need all members to fill out an information card when you come pay for your meal so that we can put the monies into the system with your member number showing that you have paid. If you bring a guest or spouse who is not a member then you will simply add the total dinners bought times the per ticket donation and it will be posted to your membership number. I would encourage each member to bring extra guests for dinner that night because it will make you look like a superstar to Elks National Foundation while at the same time not

costing you any more than a standard meal charge. Thank you so very much Christie for being so generous and all of the kitchen staff who have made the kitchen a success otherwise we would not be capable of turning a standard meal into a fundraiser for one of our largest lodge programs. One last thing ,the first February Lodge meeting is when we nominate our new officers for the 2024-2025 Elk year. We then vote for the nominees at the second lodge meeting in February. I would encourage any one who would like to be more involved with the Lodge to come to meetings and nominate/vote for anyone you feel would better our Lodge. In the past there was an annual ER Ball formal. 'When our Lodge was struggling financially it was necessary to cancel the Ball due to costs but we are obviously in a better financial state now so we will be having an outing to start back on the path of our history of having a Ball.
