February is here, and that means it's time to begin preparing for the coming year by opening nominations for lodge officers for 2024-25!

By statute, nominations open the first meeting of February, the 8th for us. Any uncontested seats after that process, meaning those with a single nominee,

will be set that evening and no further nominations needed afterward. For those positions with multiple nominees, the election will be conducted two weeks later on the 22nd. For those positions without a prior nominee, nominations will be accepted again this evening and again single nominees will be confirmed that night. This

is an important process for our lodge, and the elected positions to be confirmed are Exalted Ruler, Leading, Loyal and Lecturing Knights, Secretary, Treasurer and Five-Year Trustee.



Once the elective offices are selected the ER-Elect will be looking for motivated members to fill the Esquire, Chaplain, Inner Guard and Tiler positions. These aren't directly involved in lodge Corporate operations, but are involved in the twice-monthly meetings, and a good position to begin to learn more about the fraternal and business aspects of our lodge.

It's expected that some of the current officers will move up, while other positions will need filling anew, but you members are strongly encouraged to try for any of these positions so vital to the continuing health of both our lodge and our lounge. We cannot operate either without involved members to make up the fraternal and corporate officers. See ER Craig or me to find out more about stepping up to the fore of the Bath membership.

Our proposed Beacon and Gratitude Grant combination was approved for \$6,500. We will use our combo grant to continue our support of the *Midcoast Youth* Center. This Bath community organization strives to meet the needs of underprivileged and needy kids with a safe environment, food, clothing, and hygiene products and includes helping make connections to professional services (medical, dental, mental health) including giving rides to appointments. They also provide food to take home for those in need. Most of the youth supported are in the middle school and high school age range. We plan to work with Midcoast Youth Center to cook a hot meal at the center bimonthly or as needed by the center. We will also be available to support them with clothing donations or other needs that may arise. The goal of the project is to support our local youth and help them grow healthfully. This will make our community a better environment as the youth are the future of our community. We will know the success of our support with frequent communication with the organization.

Our Spotlight Grant activity centered around supporting the Bath Area Food Pantry. Our lodge has a long-standing relationship with the Bath Area Food Pantry and we also assist with their needs outside of this grant. If they have a specific need our members have been able to donate. The goal of the project is to assist the community with food insecurities. It's difficult to see our success in helping our community this way, but we can see the lines at the food bank and we know there is a great need that we are helping to meet in our community. Through this grant, our lodge is providing \$2,000 to the food pantry, and for every \$1 we donate, they can leverage \$5-6 worth of food!

A Grant Bonus is on the Horizon. A new Gratitude Grant bonus is coming in FY25! The new bonus, called "The Fundraising Increase Bonus" is earned when a lodge raises 10% more than it raised in the previous fiscal year. Worth \$500, the bonus can still be earned this year to be applied toward FY25's Gratitude Grant. Our lodge has exceeded the GER's current permember giving goal (\$4.80) this year, which means

we're eligible to apply for a Gratitude Grant next year and eligible to earn the \$500 bonus by meeting these goals:

- If our membership support reaches 15%. Currently, only 4.68% are donors.
- Two members are Fidelity Club members, we're there! Five of our members are Fidelity Club donors!
- Fundraising Chair score exceeds a score of 550. My current score is only 415.208, but I'm working on it.
- A 10% increase in donations over last year. Currently, we are at \$2,488.00, and last year we topped out at \$2,581.45, so only \$352 more would do it!

Did You Know?

February 14th - Celebrated as (Saint) Valentine's Day around the world, is now one of the most widely observed unofficial holidays on which romantic greeting cards and gifts are exchanged.

The earliest description of February 14 as an annual celebration of love appears in the *Charter of the Court of Love*. The charter, allegedly issued by Charles VI of France at Mantes-la-Jolie in 1400, describes lavish festivities to be attended by several members of the royal court, including a feast, amorous song and poetry competitions, jousting and dancing. Amid these festivities, the attending ladies would hear and rule on disputes from lovers. No other record of the court exists, and none of those named in the charter were present at Mantes except Charles's queen, Isabeau of Bavaria, who may well have imagined it all while waiting out a plague.

In 1868, the British chocolate company *Cadbury* created *Fancy Boxes* – a decorated box of chocolates – in the shape of a heart for Valentine's Day. Boxes of filled chocolates quickly became associated with the holiday. In the second half of the 20th century the practice



of exchanging cards was extended to all manner of gifts, such as giving jewelry.
