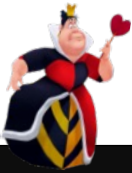

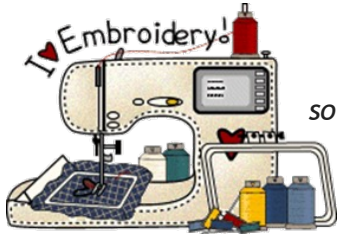

"Home Front" by Kristin Hannah

A beautiful story exploring the intimacy of family relationships, a marriage, and the dramatic affects of the toll of war on an American family. "Home Front" is a modern story of love, duty, heroism, loss, and hope of a mother conflicted between raising her family, her husband's and daughter's unwillingness to accept her career, and her love of her career as an Air Force National Guard senior pilot.

Jolene and Michael Zarkades face the struggles of everyday life: raising two daughters, careers, bills, and chores as their 12-year marriage is falling apart. When Jolene is suddenly deployed, Michael, a defense attorney, is left to struggle picking up her pace as a 'single parent', a role he is unaccustomed to. She agonizes over leaving her role as mother of her two daughters and her duty as a Soldier. Her phone calls and letters home vaguely paint a rose-colored picture of the reality of her situation.

The devastation of war hits, and the family must face their darkest fears, each fighting battles of their own. Ultimately, Michael and Jolene must decide on finding love, hope, and the strength to endure it all.

I rate it a 5 out of 5 stars. It is a powerhouse novel that leaves you wanting more. -Katrina Sharp
