Brainstorm with your Members and listen to suggestions.

Membership is the life blood of our Order. Work with your appointed Membership Retention Chair as a team. All Members are a part of your membership committee. It is important to reach out to delinguent Members to bring them back into your Lodge. It may only take one phone call. There is a chance that by speaking with that person, you may get them to renew their dues and become an active Member again. The Lodge Secretary plays a very important role for Members who were dropped for non-payment of dues. I encourage you to review Statute 14.180. This Statute is very clear that your Lodge Secretary shall advise the unaffiliated of his/ her right to re-affiliate within 60 days. Make +1 in membership a priority during your term. Finally, appoint statutory committees. Budget to be posted by second meeting of the month. Remember, "Elks Care—Elks Share" and "We Are THE Elks." Elks National Foundation Report

My brothers and sisters of Rensselaer Lodge can be very proud of our response to the charitable arm of the Grand Lodge of Elks. The Grand Exalted Ruler set the goal of \$4.80 per member for this Lodge year. You all can be proud that our Lodge has surpassed that goal by more than double. We have raised \$8,909.50 so far this Lodge year. As our per capita is based on our Lodge membership at the start of the Lodge year of 850 members, we now stand at \$10.482 per member. Our renewal rate is 81.28% and our membership support is 23.76%. We still only have 7 Fidelity Club members, which I hope will improve. New York state stands at \$1.77 per member. So, as you can see, your Lodge is again one of the leaders of New York for ENF as well as Membership recruitment. As such, we have received \$30,500 in Community Investment Program Grants to help our local community. We have received more back from ENF than we have donated.

A big thanks goes to PER Greg Collins and Natalie Wagner for the Grant presentations to Grand Lodge. It takes quite a while to understand what Grand Lodge is looking for in the presentations before they grant the awards. Thank you, Greg and Natalie.

I as chairman of this committee did not do this alone. We have far too many members who have donated to name them all, so please do not feel insulted if you are not mentioned. I and Exalted Ruler Tim appreciate all the members who have made a donation. However, I could not have done this without the support and enthusiasm of ER Tim who when called upon so to do, lent his voice and leadership to help raise funds at the Dart League and around the bar to bring our totals to where they stand. Also, Lodge Trustee Jim Walsh for making many donations to a certain jar at the bar. And to all those who also donated to the jar who see it for what it is. The Rocky Golf tournament brought in quite a few dollars to the cause which I took the liberty to attribute to many of our long-time members and others. A big thank you to PDDGER Tom Nardacci, PER John Christiansen, Loyal Knight Patrick Skelley and all those who played in the tournament.

To the seven Fidelity Club members, PER Greg Collins, PER Brian Kirch and his bride Anne Kirch, Nancy Hunt, John Rowse and PDDGER's Linda and Lawrence Rowse.

Also, we have received generous monthly donations from members Chris Linck and Joanne Netzer.

We still have a month to go, so if you have not made your donation yet, there is still time. Donations must be at ENF headquarters by March 28 to count for this fiscal year.

So, again I thank you all for your generous support for the Elks National Foundation and all that it supports including Veterans programs, Boys and Girls Hoop Shoot, Scholarships which are second only to the Federal Government, Drug Awareness Programs and Soccer Shoot.


