Hello Fellow Elks,

Wow! What a busy productive month we have had. I want to thank all that have donated their time and goods to our Veterans programs. This was an Exceptional Month all due to the generosity of members and friends of our Lodge.

The Veterans Committee Members had the Veterans Stand Down at the Cushing Street Ramada Inn on March 13th and 14th. Tucson Elks Lodge 385 collected and donated to the Stand Down the Following: 311 pieces of men's new and slightly used hats, shoes, pants, and shirts, and items including toiletries; and 343 pieces of women's new and slightly used shirts, jackets, shoes, sweaters, shorts, and pants, and socks and underwear and toiletries. The estimated value of the items donated is \$4610. Elks Lodge 385 also donated to the Homeless Program at the VA facility the following new items: 25 Backpacks, 39 T-shirts and 100 Ball Caps. The value of donations is approximately \$1132. Our Elks Lodge was pleased to donate to the State Veterans Home DVDs for their theater room and a large assortment of leather crafts.

Veterans from the Blind Rehab School come to the lodge for dinner the fourth Wednesday of every month. These men and woman are Veterans from all over America that come to train at the school at the Tucson VA. Their stories and experiences make this a fun evening.

In closing I am sure you have heard that I have a new position at our lodge as 2024/2025 Exalted Ruler. I will still remain the Chair of the Veterans Committee.

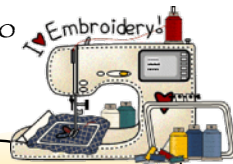
