June 17th thru August 16th: Lifeguards on duty daily 11am to 7pm.
August 17th thru End of Pool Season (TBD): Lifeguards on duty weekends only.

Pool Passes will be sold on the following dates:

Pool passes will be sold online via Zeffy, beginning Tuesday, April 16th. You may pick-up your Pool passes in the Lodge Office beginning Monday, May 6th from 10am to 2pm. (Monday – Friday). You may also purchase your Pool passes in the Lodge Office starting Monday, May 6th. You must read and sign documents to receive your passes. Pool passes are sold only to members in good standing.

Pool Pricing

Day Use Fee:

- RWC Elk Member – None/no pool pass required
- RWC Member spouse & children and grandchildren (ages 5-20) - \$15 each (or Season Pass)
- Visiting Elk - \$10 each
- Seniors, 65 and older - \$5 each
- Non-member guests - \$15 each

Season Pass/Fun Pass Punch Card:

- Season Pass RWC Member spouse & children and grandchildren (ages 5-20) - \$125 each (family maximum of \$500)
- Fun Pass, \$130.00 (10 punches per card)

Pool Rules

Everyone must check in at the Snack Shack. All members and their guests are required to check in and wear a wristband while at the pool. All members and their guests must use the pool gate entrance at the south end of the Lodge. Do not cut through the buildings to get to the pool. Members are limited to 4 guests per visit. Members must check in and pay for all guests that they have invited to relax, eat or lounge around the pool. Remember: only members and spouses can purchase goods and services at the Lodge, including alcohol.
