Our flag is to be honored. As July 4th approaches, it is a time for us to remember that we are Americans first, democrats and republicans second. As our troops have defended freedom from foreign nations, we must defend our freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and freedom to choose our leaders here at home. The future is challenging but promising.
