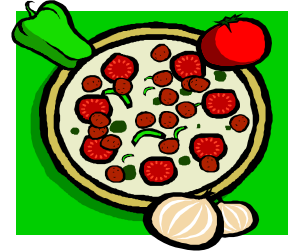

Elks National Foundation Facts

Since 1928 ENF has granted \$360 million toward Elks charitable programs nationwide. Each year ENF grants \$8.5 million to Elks Lodges for use in their communities. ENF awards 3100 scholarships annually. 30% of ENF grants come back to our State Association Charities each year. ENF funds the Elks Veterans Service Commission. ENF funds the Elks Hoop Shoot and the Drug Awareness programs. On average ENF gives back \$3.56 for every \$1.00 donated each year. The operating expense of ENF is maintained at 7.5% of overall spending which is far below the industry average of 35%.

Elks National Foundation for Negaunee and Michigan

Michigan Elks donated \$127,595 last year. ENF returned to Michigan \$325,470 in Grants, Scholarships and Program funding. That's \$2.55 back to the State for every \$1.00 donated. On top of that ENF paid \$105,400 to local lodges that applied for grants. Last year Negaunee members and fund raisers donated \$2,848 to ENF. In return Negaunee received \$6,000 in grants which we spent on our community. Every member should be proud of this Elks program. 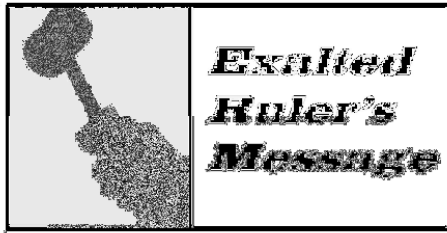
