

On November 1st 2014, I will retire and start another journey, I will continue to teach sharing gifts back and forth with students, looking find those ah-ha moments in life, and hoping to dance through the next chapter of life. What I will miss moving forward are the people. Veterans, volunteers, staff, voluntary service chiefs, all of you!

I wish everyone the same as I always have, "Live Life". Life is very worth living, time is the most precious thing you can give and I was blessed to know so many who gave so much.


