November is the month we celebrate our VETERANS.

Veterans Day is a day to celebrate the soldiers that are still alive and served in the armed forces at any time during peace and war.

- U.S. Army was established June (1775) 240 years
- U.S. Navy was established in October (1775)
- U.S. Marine Corps was established November (1775)
- U.S. Coast Guard established August (1790) 225 years
- U.S. Air Force Established September (1947) 68 years (original called the Army Air Corp.)

Veterans Day November 11th for most of us it means a day off from work or school. Be sure to spend a few minutes acknowledging the men and women who served in our armed forces. These include the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force and the Coast Guard.

Originally called "**Armistice Day**" the holiday was first celebrated in 1938 to honor World War I soldiers. November 11th was picked because the war ended at 11:00 A.M. on 11.11.1918. In 1954, after the US had been involved in two additional wars, World War II and Korea, the holiday was renamed **Veterans Day**, to honor the brave soldiers that fought in all three wars.

On Saturday November 7th we are having our annual Veterans Dinner for our members and guests. Appetizers are at 5:00 and dinner will be served at 6:00. It will be a prime rib dinner again this year. Tickets are on sale in the lodge see a bartender or a Veterans Committee member. Ticket prices are \$16.00, a bit more than last year because the price of beef has risen. This is a great bargain so please support our committee's fund raising efforts and buy a ticket or two and come and enjoy a great meal. We sold out last year and are limited to only 120 tickets this year. Get your tickets early so we can get an accurate count for the chef. 




