Voting is **November 7th!** Come down that day to the lodge for voting!

- 1. Changing all "he" to "he/she"
- 2.Article X: Fees and Dues pg. 21: Change twenty-sixth birthday to twenty-first Birthday. Take out 2nd paragraph; due to copy of first paragraph.
- 3. Article III Section 2; 1st paragraph; adding not including Grand Lodge or State per capita
- 4. Change OF THE TRUSTEES OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS; (PG.9) OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
- 5. OF THE TILER (PG.12) the sum of dues change from \$103.15 to "current dues to include State and Grand Lodge per capita
- 6. House Rules: #15 add "member or non-member" while on duty
- 7. House Rules: #16 add "non-member" after "will be sent out on errands for members"
- 8. House Rules: #17 add "members or non-members" after " Employees on duty"
- 9. House Rules: # 17 add "except members", after "Employees should not be in the Club or Lodge facilities when not on duty".
- 10. Moving meetings from 7:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- 11. Moving meetings to Tuesday nights instead of Thursday nights
- 12. Change meetings from every week to 2nd and 4th Thursday
- 13. A credit card charge of \$5 for dues; if paying by credit card.
