

HOOP SHOOT CHAMPION



Jackson Ramirez, 11, is our Lodge Free Throw champion! He won in the 8 & 9 year old category for the 2019-2020 year. On his continued journey to the National Finals in Chicago, Illinois he won the Central District, Northern California, California/Hawaii state and the West Region 7 finals in Las Vegas, Nevada in March of 2020. BUT then came the Pandemic and the "Shelter-In-Place" proclamation that cancelled the National Championships scheduled for April of 2020.

Through some creative thinking and some serious hard work, the Eiks National Hoop Shoot HQ brass decided to conduct virtually, the Regional finals for the nine regional districts that were unable to complete their contests live with the participants. The regional champs were crowned at the end of March 2021.

Beginning April 1st of 2021, each of the twelve regional champions conducted the "Virtual National Finals". This competition is taking place during the entire month of April across the country. Once the results are computed by the HQ Hoop Shoot officials in Chicago, the champions and other placements will be announced.

As for Jackson, a talented, hardworking player, he was well prepared for his recorded contest April 1st at the Elevate Training Center in Concord. Jackson proceeded to make all 25 free throws for a perfect score as well as the additional 25 for 25 tiebreaker shots for a perfect score of 50 for 50 free throws. He's earned a minimum 1st Place Tie for the National Championship in his division. Stay tuned for updates as we await confirmation that Jackson's score is the winning score!
