Did you know –

In December 1941, Franklin Roosevelt became the first President to use an armored vehicle. Originally belonging to infamous gangster Al Capone, the car was seized by the Treasury Department in 1932 on an income-tax evasion charge.

The attack on Pearl Harbor created a wave of patriotism and outrage. Less than a year after Pearl Harbor, 50 million of 132 million Americans were employed in the war effort working for the government. Japan, now one of America's strongest allies, is the [largest source of international tourists](#) to the state of Hawaii. Japanese visitors pay their respects at National Memorial just as Americans do. The legendary figure of [Santa Claus](#) can be traced back to [St. Nicholas](#), a Turkish-born monk from the Third Century who gained fame wandering the countryside helping the poor and sick.

An Iron Age tradition of burning huge logs to ring in the New Year evolved over the centuries into a rich Christmas dessert made of rolled sponge cake and whipped cream. At the end of December, Celtic and Gaelic cultures used to decorate a large log with holly, pine cones, and a splash of wine and burn it to cleanse the old year and usher in the spring.

Penned by a Northerner who proudly fought for the [Confederacy](#), "[Jingle Bells](#)" never mentions Christmas, but does talk about drag-racing sleighs and picking up girls. The song's composer, James Lord Pierpont, broke with his Boston family's abolitionist stance and joined the South in the [Civil War](#), where he wrote popular Confederate anthems like "We Conquer, Or Die!" "Jingle Bells" was originally titled "One Horse Open Sleigh" and may have first been performed in blackface.

In 1939, retail giant Montgomery Ward came up with the idea of writing its own Christmas book to hand out to kids during the coming holiday shopping season. The task fell to copywriter Robert May, who took inspiration from his daughter's love of the reindeers at the zoo and his own childhood as a small, shy kid who was never invited to play sports. More than 2 million copies of the original "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" illustrated booklet were distributed in 1939 and the character instantly became a beloved part of American Christmas lore.

The competition will be at Sam Houston High School Gym B and we will need Elks, DOES, spouses and friends of the lodge to help keep score, judge the foul line, return balls/ ball shaggers, registration, and a cheering squad. Please make plans to join in and make this another successful Elk event!

We have fun watching boys and girls, ages 8 thru 13, doing their best to sink as many baskets as possible in their 25 allotted shots.

Six local winners will proceed to the North Central District Contest on January 14th, 2023. We will also need help for this contest, but the size and time frame are smaller. Please plan to volunteer. Winners of the District Contest will advance to our State Contest on February 18th, 2023. Winners of State go to Regional on March 18th and winners of Regional become National Finalists and go to Chicago for the National Contest on April 22nd, 2023.

The contest will run differently for the lodge contest than it has in the past. We will be shooting by age group, 8-9, 10-11 and 12-13, with boys at one court and girls at the other end.
