#### Did you know -

In December 1941, Franklin Roosevelt became the first President to use an armored vehicle. Originally belonging to infamous gangster Al Capone, the car was seized by the Treasury Department in 1932 on an income-tax evasion charge.

The attack on Pearl Harbor created a wave of patriotism and outrage. Less than a year after Pearl Harbor, 50 million of 132 million Americans were employed in the war effort working for the government. Japan, now one of America's strongest allies, is the <u>largest source of international tourists</u> to the state of Hawaii. Japanese visitors pay their respects at National Memorial just as Americans do.The legendary figure of <u>Santa Claus</u> can be traced back to <u>St. Nicholas</u>, a Turkish-born monk from the Third Century who gained fame wandering the countryside helping the poor and sick.

An Iron Age tradition of burning huge logs to ring in the New Year evolved over the centuries into a rich Christmas dessert made of rolled sponge cake and whipped cream. At the end of December, Celtic and Gaelic cultures used to decorate a large log with holly, pine cones, and a splash of wine and burn it to cleanse the old year and usher in the spring.

Penned by a Northerner who proudly fought for the <a href="Confederacy">Confederacy</a>, "Jingle Bells" never mentions Christmas, but does talk about drag-racing sleighs and picking up girls. The song's composer, James Lord Pierpont, broke with his Boston family's abolitionist stance and joined the South in the <a href="Civil War">Civil War</a>, where he wrote popular Confederate anthems like "We Conquer, Or Die!" "Jingle Bells" was originally titled "One Horse Open Sleigh" and may have first been performed in blackface.

In 1939, retail giant Montgomery Ward came up with the idea of writing its own Christmas book to hand out to kids during the coming holiday shopping season. The task fell to copywriter Robert May, who took inspiration from his daughter's love of the reindeers at the zoo and his own childhood as a small, shy kid who was never invited to play sports. More than 2 million copies of the original "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" illustrated booklet were distributed in 1939 and the character instantly became a beloved part of American Christmas lore.

### ENF grants, programs bolster communities



October brings to us many Elks activities and family fun. Let's start with the most important program in our Order, the Elks National Foundation (ENF). As your Grand Exalted Ruler, I have once again established the goal of \$4.80 per Member per capita. When you do the calculation for this goal, that's just a little over \$.01 a day. For each Lodge dollar donated, ENF could potentially repay hefty dividends for the programs offered.

Your Lodge can and should apply for the various grants to assist your communities: Beacon Grant, Gratitude Grant, Spotlight Grant, Promise Grant, Impact Grant, and Freedom Grant.
