

A win for the deer hide transformed into tanned leather. A win for the veteran for Wheelchair gloves and leather crafting.

Did you know that by donating your deer hides to your local Elks lodge you can help thousands of disabled veterans?

3,460 pairs of Wheelchair gloves were donated to disabled veterans

7,592 square feet of crafting leather was donated to Veteran Hospitals and clinics.

49,789 Crafting and Occupational Kits were manufactured and given to disabled veterans

68,429 square feet of crafting leather was given to help heal our veterans.

3,560 deer hides were collected last year in Iowa.

History of our Lodge Buildings!

Buying our own building was the long time goal of members, officers and trustees of West Des Moines Lodge #2752. Our Lodge was chartered in 1989 and for the first twenty four years of existence occupied two leased properties. The first two years were spent meeting in a "free" community room at the West Des Moines Community Center in Valley Junction. From 1991 until 2007 we occupied a small building in front of the Motel Relax on Hickman Rd in Urbandale. These were lean years - with officers & trustees & members donating money at times to keep the rent paid and the lights on! During our time there we began holding Bingo two times per week and slowly were able to build up funds to be able to afford more upgrades. In a hopeful leap, we moved across the street to the former Baker's Cafeteria space in Sherwood Forest in Windsor Heights. At that time we added a third day of Bingo and our Membership grew quickly and our Bingo, Lodge Events, rentals and clubroom business finally began growing at a very good pace. During these years we were able to build up a good bank balance that would allow us to make a down payment on our own building - if we could ever find one we could afford! We had several building search committees through the years and nearing the end of our five year lease - looking at significantly higher rents coming, we finally found our "forever" home - our current location at 2060 NW 94th Street in Clive!

Interestingly enough, even before moving to Sherwood Forest, one of the first buildings that a committee looked at was our current location! However, the asking price was a little too steep so other properties were looked at. None were found that fit our specific needs. Over the years, the officers and trustees of West Des Moines Lodge #2752 had kept their eyes on the wonderful property at 2060 NW 94th Street in Clive that we had looked at so many years before because it was a great fit for our purposes. As luck would have it, in 2013 the property was on the market again. The property was originally developed in 1995 as the home of Raul's Mexican Restaurant. After Raul's closed, the building was occupied by a series of nightclub establishments, none of which were able to stay in business for the long haul. As soon as it became for sale this last time, our Lodge immediately put together a purchase proposal, which needed to be backed by the Iowa State Elks Association, our State Sponsor and finally approved by the Grand Lodge Board of Trustees. It was a long and challenging approval process, but ultimately approval was granted and financing secured with the help of Veridian Credit Union, and we were on the way to purchasing our own Lodge Home. We took possession of the property on September 3rd, 2013 but the work had just begun. There was a lot of equipment and furniture left behind by the previous owner that needed to be disposed of and once that was accomplished the remodeling process began. Many members of our Lodge spent countless hours painting, drywalling, ripping out and rebuilding walls and redoing flooring. You can see evidence of their good work when you look at the beautiful interior of our building. Upon completion of all of the hard work by so many contractors and members, the building was ready to be occupied in December. Again, our Lodge members stepped up to help with the move from Windsor Heights to Clive. To commemorate our new Lodge, a Grand Opening Celebration was held on February 8th, 2014.

When our Lodge Officers proposed the purchase, it was with the intention that we would be diligent and focused to pay down the mortgage as quickly as possible and own the property outright. Because of sound fiscal practices exercised by our Officers and Trustees over the years, our Lodge was on track to pay off the mortgage in 2020. But, as you know, in 2020 the global Covid-19 pandemic occurred and we were forced to readjust our plans. Two plus short years later, our Lodge rebounded quickly and we were able to make up for lost time. We made our final mortgage payment on December 6th, 2022. This is cause for celebration and members of our Lodge should be proud of this great accomplishment!

FUN FACTS ABOUT OUR BUILDING

When we took possession of the property, the previous owners had just walked away, taking very little with them. TVs, several couches, computers, tables and chairs and a lot of sound equipment were left behind. We were able to sell some of the very large speakers and sub-woofers and make a little money. There were many alterations needed to make the building "fit" our unique needs! The walls had been painted a bright red and it took a lot of work to get them repainted to a more pleasant neutral color! When Raul's Mexican Restaurant occupied the building, the back room (where we now serve food and play Bingo), was a patio. At some point in time, one of the previous owners had it enclosed. The closet in the backroom was a restroom and there was a second bar where our steam table sits now. There were two raised dance floors in the Club Room and Lodge Room and lounge booths lining the walls. The restrooms and the bar in the clubroom have not changed, but walls were removed and new walls erected to separate the "Clubroom" from the Lodge Room - allowing us to have a great facility for both sides. The Lodge Room and West "back room/serving area work great for Bingo - keeping that source of income strong and we are able to manage finances without doing rentals to non-members!
