Paul Stiles West Des Moines Lodge #2752 Elk of the Year 2023-2024





West Des Moines Lodge #2752 is proud to nominate Paul Stiles for Elk of the Year.

Paul was initiated into our order on September 22nd, 2003 and holds member number 545. He was interested in becoming an Elk because he admired the fact that the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is dedicated to Veterans and our communities. He is a veteran of the United States Air Force and is proud to say that enlisting was the best decision he ever made.

After becoming a member, Paul immediately became involved in Lodge Leadership and moved through the Officer Chairs and served as our Exalted Ruler for the Elk Year 2006-2007. The high point of his year as ER was getting our Lodge moved from a small, slightly run down building that stood in front of a rather seedy motel into a much nicer space just a short distance away. At the time, the move was controversial with even our State Sponsor questioning the validity of the move but in the end, with Paul's perseverance, a vote was taken and all 78 members in attendance voted for the move.

Paul has also served as a Trustee of the West Des Moines Lodge for a total of 12 years, often times making tough decisions that no one else wanted to make but were for the betterment of our Lodge. He is a faithful and tireless volunteer and has willingly given many hours of his time in numerous capacities around the Lodge. He has acted as club manager, kitchen manager, food and supply orderer, Bingo seller, bartender, dish washer, janitor, painter, audio-visual set-up and repair-the list goes on and on. If there is something that has needed to be done, rest assured, Paul has done it. In addition, he and his wife, Rhonda, prepare and serve at least one Wednesday night dinner a month. He readily steps up to provide mentorship to the officers and trustees who have followed him.

Paul Stiles exemplifies the tenets of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks-Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity. West Des Moines Lodge #2752 is very appreciative of his diligence, knowledge and dedication and is proud to nominate him for Elk of the Year, 2023-2024.

Lodge Rentals

All non Elk sponsored functions being held at West Des Moines Lodge #2752 must be vetted through our rental coordinator, Becky Young. This includes Birthday, Retirement, Anniversary and Graduation Parties; Bridal and Baby Showers; School and Family Reunions; and Celebrations of Life. We do this to make sure that the preferred date is available, to have enough bartenders working, and assign an officer or trustee to attend the event to ensure that everything goes smoothly.

West Des Moines Lodge #2752 is not an Events Center and we do not rent to the public but we do allow members to rent our facility for parties. Our rental rates are very reasonable and charges are as follows: the Clubroom is offered during normal operating hours at no charge if the number of attendees are estimated to be less than 60 people. If the number of people will exceed 60, we will need a second bartender for a charge of \$100. If an event is scheduled during non business hours, we charge \$100 for opening the building and hiring a bartender. Aronson Hall may be rented at a charge of \$350 regardless of whether it is during normal operating hours or not. The kitchen may only be used with prior approval. The member who is renting the facility must be present for the entire event and is responsible for all cleanup.

In addition, all rentals are subject to a fee of approximately \$175 for a one time event insurance policy. This extra insurance protects our Lodge against any liability resulting from a non Elk event.
