ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION YEAR END REPORT

I'm baaack! Last fiscal year that ended March 31, our final total donated to the ENF was \$9,519.50. That gave us a \$11.199 per capita total. The GER goal was \$4.80 for the year. We had 23.88% membership support. We had 7 Fidelity Club members. And we received \$9,000.00 in Grants from ENF to help our community. Overall, a very good year.

This year, Exalted Ruler Paul has asked me to again be the Lodge ENF Chairman. I have accepted that role. We discussed the goals for our Lodge ENF fundraising and have agreed that last year was fantastic but wish to do even better this year. So, our goal this year is to exceed a total of \$10,000.00 total and at least a \$12.00 per member giving total. To accomplish this our Lodge needs to do two things. More members have to participate with giving and all members have to dig a little deeper into their pockets and give a couple bucks more.

City of Rensselaer's Heroes Banner Program

Would you like to honor and memorialize your respect for a Rensselaer Veteran?

The Rensselaer Heroes Banner Program was established several years ago to proudly display and recognize Veterans from the City of Rensselaer.

To quality, honorees must meet the following requirements:

- Born in Rensselaer was or is a resident when enlisted.
- Served or is serving in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard.

As an ongoing program, applications are continually accepted for those who wish to sponsor a banner. Banners may be sponsored by individuals or organizations who are responsible for the full cost of the banner.

Banners are displayed every year, from mid-May until mid-November, for a three-year period. At the end of the third year, banners may be picked up and new banners ordered.

The Mayor's Office runs the Heroes Banner Program. Applications are available at Mayor Michael Stammel's Office located at 62 Washington Street in Rensselaer.

Banner applications can also be found in our Lodge near the Fallen Comrades Table.

East Greenbush Hometown Heroes Banner Project

East Greenbush Hometown Heroes Banner Project

Would you like to honor and memorialize the respect of an East Greenbush Veteran?

The Hometown Heroes Banner Project began last year and continually accepts applications. The effort is called East Greenbush HERO – Hometown Earned Recognition Operation. This Veteran Banner Program recognizes residents who have protected and served our nation with the military.

HERO was proposed by Ed Nestler, who is a combat veteran who served with the Army. Ed is also a member of our Lodge and the Commander of VFW Post #7338 in East Greenbush.

The first banner that was displayed in June honored Melvin Rhodes, an East Greenbush resident who was killed in action just hours before World War I ended.

The HERO program intends to show East Greenbush will never forget the service of our Veterans and their families. Veterans banners are on display throughout the town Memorial Day through Veterans Day each year.

Under the program, Veterans who called East Greenbush their home (or their family members) can sponsor a banner that includes a picture of the Veteran along with the Veteran's name and branch of service. Veterans, or their families, can choose the roads where the banner will be displayed, based on availability of locations.

Qualifications for a banner are:

- The veteran must have been honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces or died in the line of duty.
- The veteran must have personal ties to the Town of East Greenbush, such as born in East Greenbush, or resided in East Greenbush at some time in life.


