Leanne Farr of Mesa (Jacob's mom) thought her 2-year old had chronic allergies. What he had was a rare and aggressive form of cancer – acute non-lymphocytic leukemia (ANL) – and only a 25 percent chance of surviving. Doctors began chemotherapy immediately and began making plans for a bone marrow transplant. Fortunately, Jacob's sister was a perfect match to donate bone marrow. Leanne learned of a new experimental transplant procedure that could be done without radiation at the Steele Center. It was a difficult procedure and a long ordeal. Jacob is now 7 and in good health. He enjoys Karate and playing with his three sisters. Advances in medical research have made it possible for Jacob (and his family) to live a normal life.

Our next meeting and potluck lunch is **Monday, May 13**th at 9:30 am, which is right after the AZ Elks Annual Meeting. We ladies have been working hard to raise money for Arizona Elks Major Projects. We have a booth at the convention to raffle quilts and to sell different items that we have made. In addition to convention activities, we have made and donated 58 pillowcases, stuffed Lollie Dollies and our famous kitties named Jillian, 10 crib sheets to the NICU, and 28 kids surgical caps that were given to Lori Castro of the Steele Center on April 8th at the last meeting. Lori comes to our meetings and we are always happy to fill her car up with gifts from the Lodge.
