Deadlines, programs, training wrap up Lodge year The Elks Lodge year is coming to a close but now is not the time to sit back and relax. You still have the opportunity to complete some unfinished projects and finish strong. All of the various programs and awards for your Lodge and Members are due this month. Take the chance to review Elks programs on elks.org to see what awards and certificates of achievement you can give to your Members. One great program is the Contest "A" - All American Lodge Contest. Although you may believe your Lodge does not qualify for this award, you should still submit the application to see where your Lodge stands and where you can make improvements next year to continue showing "Elkdom's Heart for America." This is also the deadline for all yearly contributions to Elks National Membership stats must be finalized GRAND SECRETARY Bryan R. Klatt Local Lodge Secretaries are reminded that they must have all membership records for 2024-2025 ready for year-end closeout finalized by 12:00 a.m. PT on March 31. Failure to update records can, and probably will, cause membership totals to be out of balance in the Chicago Lodge Membership System (CLMS2Web). Also, the Financial Reporting System (FRS) monthly and year-end financials must be filed by March 31 [GLS: Section 13.040, 1.(g)], then every third Friday of the month thereafter. A Lodge's failure to comply with the new FRS program can result in fines being assessed. [GLS: Section 13.040, 2.(c)] The input of required data for the yearly charity report must be provided and submitted by, on, or before May 1 via CLMS. Message from the Grand Exalted Ruler DOUGLAS A. SCHIEFER Foundation. I know your Lodge has met, or is close to meeting, the \$5.00 per Member goal. There are also many ENF awards and certificates for your Lodge and Members. These should be applied for and given out. ENF provides money to your State Association, as well as funding many grant programs for your community activities. The most common recommendation from your Grand Lodge Area Auditor is for Lodges to better use the ENF grants to help improve operations. Most programs funded by your Lodge could be funded by ENF, which creates even more opportunities for your Lodge to have a greater impact. Best wishes to all our new Lodge Officers who are going to be committed to governing the many practices and traditions that are fundamental to making our Lodges the best they can be. I hope that the transition will be smooth because it's important that the experienced Officers mentor and help the new Officers to make the Lodge year a success. Please take time to have a training program within the Lodge or district like the Elks Kollege of Knowledge that educates and trains new Officers to do their job. Mentoring new Officers can make a smooth, prepared transition. New Exalted Rulers you must list your committee appointments and give the list to the Lodge Secretary. Secretaries, please give this information to your District Deputy for the Lodge directory. This information then should be entered into CLMS2. What would we do without our Secretaries who keep everything in order? Thank you for your service. I know it's a busy time for you as you are preparing the year-end reports. Leaders of the Lodge, it is time to solidify your budget for the upcoming year and make any adjustments that are needed. This is also a time to evaluate what needs to be fixed. Any successful endeavor takes teamwork. March is the time to celebrate St. Patrick's Day. One thing we all know how to do well is to have fun and fellowship with our Members in Elkdom. Thank you for your service. you all, God bless our troops, and God bless America!



February may be the shortest month of the year, but it is also one of the most important of the year. There are two activities that are to be completed this month. One is nominations of new officers for the fraternal year 2025-2026. As Grand Exalted Ruler Schiefer stated in his message, not only that those nominated are qualified to do the job chosen, but that they need to be supported. Words are cheap, but actions speak volumes. Don't be afraid to be pro-active and step forward when you see a job that needs to be done. We get the district winners competing for a slot in the Regional contest being held in Nampa, Idaho. I will be there along with other Oregon officers and our State Director, Stephen May. There is a fun activity after the shooters are done, where the state presidents have a shoot-off with the winner receiving \$100.00 from the other presidents to be donated to the Elks National Foundation. I don't plan on donating, but I probably will even if I win. The other contest is the State Scholarship. It will be held at the Bend Lodge on Feb. 22nd. This is a very important day for our senior students from around the state. After meeting them and hearing about their accomplishments you cannot help but realize that there is hope for our nation's future. They are truly the best and brightest of our youth.


